

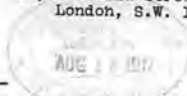

STATEMENTS BY WITNESSES.



Lieut R.C.Hall, 75th Light Trench Mortar Battery, attached Trench Mortar School, Lynnhurst, states:-

On Friday, 22nd February, 1918, at about 3.30 p.m. I was in charge of a detachment consisting of four M.C.O.'s and a Stokes 3 in. Trench Mortar, engaged in live firing practice at Lynnhurst, Hants. Under my instruction, forty bombs had been prepared for firing, after careful inspection by members of the detachment under the supervision of Sergt Fergus. I gave the order for "five rounds deliberate fire, at 575 yards" the propellant used being the green cartridge with the ballistite rings. The detachment consisted of:-

- (1) No 836 Sergt. Martin. 1st Bn. Newfoundland Regt, who was firing.
- (2) No 13503 Sergt. Collett. 3rd Bn. K.O.S.B. who was working the traversing and elevating gear.
- (3) No 12646 Sergt. Fergus. 3rd Bn. Royal Scots, who was acting as an ammunition number, and
- (4) No 18386 Corpl Nowell. W.A. 3rd Bn. Lincolnshire Regt, who was also acting as an ammunition number.

Four bombs were fired without incident; but the fifth bomb exploded in the gun on shock or discharge, causing the injury to Sergt Martin, Sergt Collett and Sergt Fergus. I immediately sent a messenger for the medical Officer and had first aid administered. I then proceeded to examine the gun-pit, and found the lower guide and cartridge container of the premature bomb, which I now produce. On examination of this I discovered that one of the holes drilled for turning purposes, had blown completely through, indicating a serious defect in the manufacture. This defect, which was of a nature impossible to detect on examination when preparing, was, in my opinion, the cause of the premature, and there was not sufficient resistance to take the shock of discharge, which caused detonation (or more probably, partial detonation of the high explosive in the bomb.

On the afternoon of the 22nd February, 1918 about 3.30 p.m. I was acting as an ammunition number to a detachment engaged in live firing practice with the 3" Stokes Mortar. Sgt Martin was firing, Sgt Collett was working the traversing and elevating gear and Sgt. Fergus was also an ammunition number. On the fifth bomb being fired a premature explosion occurred in the gun, causing injuries to Sgt Martin, Sgt Collett, and Sgt. Fergus. After the explosion I proceeded with Lieut Hall to the gun-pit, where we discovered the lower guide of the premature bomb, with cartridge container complete, which I now identify. On examining this we found that one of the holes drilled for turning purposes had been blown through by the explosion of the propellant charge. In my opinion, this defect was the cause of the premature.

I am senior Serjt-Instructor at the Trench Mortar School, Lyndhurst. I have had a very extensive experience of Stokes 3in Trench Mortars both in England & France. On the morning of the 22nd February 1918, I, along with Serjts Martin & Collett, examined and prepared 40 bombs for live firing practice. I was in charge of the party. In accordance with our usual custom, we carefully examined all the ammunition, paying particular attention to lower guides and cartridge containers, when we were able to detect no defects. On the afternoon of the 22nd February 1918, I was acting as an ammunition carrier to the detachment engaged in live firing practice. I have no recollection of anything which happened after the explosion, which occurred shortly after the practice commenced.

Capt. W.M.S. Jackson, R.A.M.C. Lyndhurst, states:-

On Friday, 22nd February, 1918, about 5.35 p.m. I was called to attend to three N.C.O's who had been injured during live firing practice of Stokes 3" Trench Mortars. I found Sergeant Martin with a lacerated wound on the left leg, which involved the muscles and tendons below the calf. The bleeding was insignificant and the N.C.O was not suffering from profound shock. The wound was dressed immediately and Serjt. Martin was transferred to a stretcher. I found Serjt Collett suffering from shock, and what were apparently superficial injuries of the abdomen. He was placed upon a stretcher and along with Serjt Martin, was transferred to the ambulance. Serjt Fergus was suffering from very slight superficial cuts on the face, and some contusion around the left eye. All three N.C.O's were immediately despatched to the New Zealand Hospital at Brookenhurst where they were detained for treatment.
