I wish to bring the case of the above mentioned man to your attention.

I enclose the complete file of his papers and correspondence in order that you may see the various stages of his history. From his records, it appears that he enlisted on May 8th, 1918 and was granted Home Leave on May 30th to Carbonear. On June 2nd he was reported sick at home and reported back to the Depot on August 27th, having been under the care of Dr. Boyle during that period.

On September 5th he was granted leave of absence without pay for two weeks by Captain Nunns and since that time has been away until January 7th, 1919 when he reported back with a Medical Certificate from Dr. Stentaforde.

During this second period of illness, he was attended regularly by Dr. Boyle, who forwarded Medical Certificates as to his condition at regular intervals.

Efforts were made from time to time to try and get him into St. John's for investigation into his case and for any medical treatment necessary. If he has been genuinely sick during the period of his leave of absence without pay, does he come on pay again at the expiration of that leave?

In view of the Medical Certificates and the decision of the S.M.B. that he is no longer fit for General Service, I wish to be advised as to what steps are to be taken in his case.

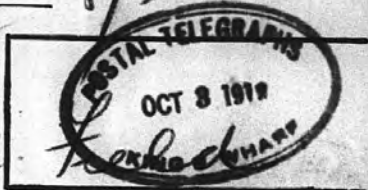

SIR:

I take the liberty of writing you about one of our recruits residing at Carbonear by name of Charles McCarthy, Regimental No. 4969. Since this man enlisted we have had considerable trouble with him on account of absence. From 27-6-18 to 27-8-18 he was constantly reported sick in Carbonear and after a lot of trouble we got him back to Depot, where, upon examination by the Medical authorities, he was found fit for duty and placed on parade. He gave no signs of being unwell while on duty, but on the 4-9-18 he asked for leave to go to Carbonear to secure some hay, which was granted, he to return on 19-9-18. An extension of leave was refused, but he did not return, but on 24-9-18 he sent a wire to say his foot was swollen and he could not get his boot on.

Nothing further was heard until 3-10-18, when he informed us by wire that he "missed the morning train, but would be in tomorrow."

He has evidently missed every train since, as he has not reported. You will note by this record he does not seem anxious to return and my object in writing you is to ask your assistance in dealing with him. His illness during the two months he spent at home appears to be imaginary and he is again at home for no apparent reason. Would you mind making enquiries about him and let me know if there is any good cause as to why he should not be in the Barracks. I am inclined to think from his record that he is a 'stay-at-home'.

Any information that you can give us about him will be appreciated, as we want to be in a position to deal with him fairly but with due regard to military discipline.

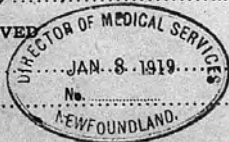
