I have your communication of 7th instant in connection with the above noted man. Private McIsaac proceeded Overseas on September 22nd together with other soldiers.

I am not aware of the circumstances mentioned, but would point out that where a large number of soldiers are travelling together and proceeding by train for transport abroad, it is not usual for them to be allowed to leave the train at any station. The Draft was under the orders of the Officer Commanding, who, of course, would not know whether any particular man had friends at one station or another.

If any relative of his had asked for the Officer Commanding Draft, and explained the circumstances, I have not the least doubt but that they could have seen Private McIsaac.
