Dear Mac:

Who would have thought about three years ago that I should write you in Germany? Fortunes of War, I suppose. Remember the little luncheon party we had when you were last on leave? Smallwood was in a couple of days ago, and we were lamenting the absence of the third party. Fred is on his way home, on special 2 month's leave, to settle up his Father's estate. He sends best wishes to you.

We were glad to hear your wound was not serious and that you were otherwise well. I know Germany pretty well, having been through it in June and July 1914, but I was not at Altdamm. How do you like the country round there?

Now as regards your parcels of food and clothing, which I am sure are of vital interest to you. The N.W.C.A. are forwarding your regular food supplies, and Burt is busy on the clothing question. Already a first issue has gone forward, in addition to the special requests in your card dated 5/5/18. Let me know if you wish anything else at any time, and I will do my best to get it sent you.

As you requested, I informed the lady in Southsea so soon as I knew of your casualty.

I expect you heard that the "FLORIZEL" was sunk in a blizzard off Cape Race last month. 100 people lost their lives including Jack Munn, Tom McNeil, Froude (of Dicks & Co.) and his wife, Michael Connolly and son, Butler the architect and wife, J.H. Baggs, Bob Wright, Mcl. O'Driscoll, J.M. McCoubray, and Capt. Joe Kean. It was a bad business and a great blow to the Old Island.

I am sorry to tell you 2/Lt. Kershaw died from wounds the other day. No other of your friends lately.

All in the Office unite with me in sending you the very best wishes. Keep in touch with me, and above all notify us immediately you change your address. Miss Knox has got an eagle eye on your food supplies!

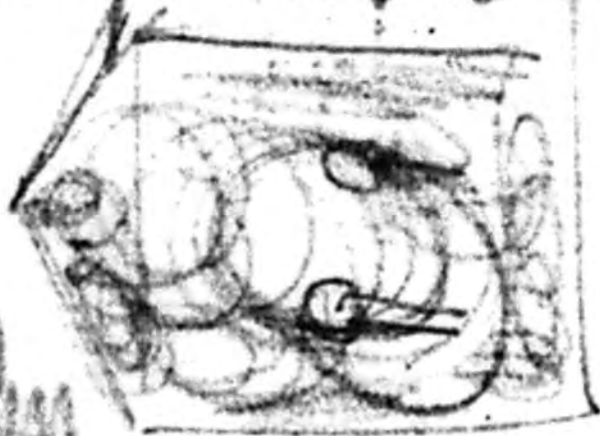
