NOTES.—(i.) Dear Madam,

In reply to your letter of the 31st October, we have a balance of £3.13.10 from your cheque, sent for the provision of food parcels for Pte. McWhirter, Prisoner of War.

Your cheque was received on the 25th June, and Pte. McWhirter was repatriated on the 18th August. Parcels had been sent forward for him for a period of a fortnight after that date so that from the time your cheque was received till his parcels were stopped was ten weeks, at a cost of 17/6d per week, or a total of £8.15.0. This deducted from your cheque £12.8.10 leaves the balance stated.

As the sending of parcels to prisoners had ceased when we received your letter, we were not able to devote this money to the care of a Canadian Prisoner of War, as you suggested. Will you please say whether you now wish it to be handed to the Canadian Red Cross Society, or whether you would like us to return it to you.

We will hold the money awaiting your reply,



Dear Madam:-

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 13th March, regarding the sending of parcels to 846 Pte. McWhorter, who is a prisoner of war. The regulations governing the despatch of parcels to prisoners of war, as issued by the War Office are very strict and concise. A Committee known as the Central Prisoners of War Committee has been appointed by the War Office in London, to handle all matters pertaining to prisoners of war. Under that Committee are the different Societies and Associations which handle particular units. The Newfoundland War Contingent Association is that which looks after the welfare of Newfoundland prisoners of war; the instructions are to receive no parcels whatever from private parties for despatch to Germany, everything must be purchased and despatched by the authorized Association.

Three food parcels a fortnight are despatched by them from the time of receipt of report that a man is a prisoner. Clothing also is forwarded as soon as the report has been received, and further supplies of clothing are forwarded at stated intervals. Everything possible is done for their comfort and welfare of prisoners of war.

March 25th, 1918.

There is now an arrangement which is not in any way concerned or controlled by this Department, and is not in any way governed by Military Regulations, whereby the next of kin of prisoners of war are permitted to forward one parcel containing certain specified articles, and weighing not more than 11 pounds, but only one such parcel may be forwarded once a quarter.

For further particulars concerning this "Quarterly personal parcel", I would refer you to the Honorary Secretary Women's Patriotic Association, St. John's, who has the management of this matter.
