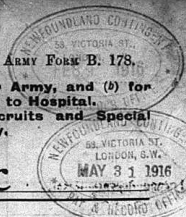

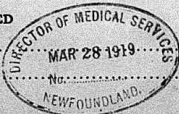

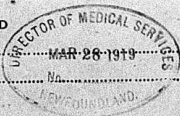

Circumstances of Capture - We were scattered about in shell-holes during the attack, and all our Company Officers were knocked out. When the Germans made their counter-attack they broke through on our left and we were completely surrounded. I think I was about the last man in our Regiment to be taken. I was wounded slightly in the leg.

Details of Life & Treatment under capture - We were sent to Douai for two days and then on to Fort MacDonald in Lille for 5 days. Then I was shifted to Guesnain for about two months ~~am~~ working parties on the railroads. We had long hours of hard work daily and very little to eat. Any man who was too weak to work had a hard time of it for he was simply forced to it. I saw one Englishman, a man called Potter of the East Yorks, who was so weak that he could not even stand up at his work, being kicked as he lay on the ground by a German corporal. Potter died as a result about half hour afterwards. The under officers in charge of the working parties were very brutal. I was then sent to Marchiennes for about three weeks, when I was taken very ill with general weakness and debility and my wound got septic, because I was not able to have it attended to properly. I was sent to Hospital in Tournai where I spent two months. There were nine of our Regiment in this hospital at the time and three of them died there - Atwood, Lane & Cummings. Then I went back to Marchiennes again for about a month. My next move was to Friedericksville in Westphalia for three weeks and then to Gustron in Meiklenburg for a week. Then I was shifted again to Friederickhort about 15 miles from Kiel for three months. We were set to work here on the Railroads. For the first six weeks the food was very bad but then the Red Cross Parcels began to arrive and so we were much better off. Then I was sent to the Island of Ulsen just off Schleswig-Holstein in March 1918 and remained there until after the Armistice was signed. I had to do various kinds of farming work. On the whole the treatment was not too bad except for the long hours and hard work. I was repatriated to England via Copenhagen and arrived in Leith on Christmas Day.

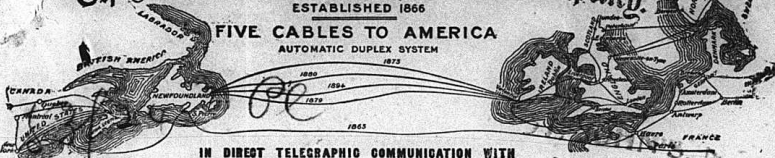

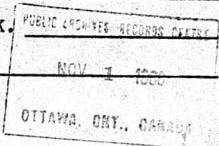
