I am writing on behalf of James Goudie, late private in the Nfld regiment, who volunteered in the spring of 1918 from this district.

After the cessation of hostilities he & two others, Stephen MacDonald & Charles Michelin, were given passages to Battle Harbour on a steamer that left St Johns on Nov. 24.

Being landed there, some 300 miles from the homes of the ~~late~~ Goudie & Michelin, they had to board themselves until dogteam travel became possible, & then pay their own travelling expenses home.

I can personally certify that they did not reach home till Jan. 26, as I met them (still two days march from here) on the twenty-fourth.

Goudie understands that an application by MacDonald, for a refund, was successful. A Newfoundland school-teacher undertook to see into the matter for him, last spring, but no result followed.

From the Labradorman's point of view, it is rather a tax on patriotism to be landed 300 miles from home & left to bear all the expenses subsequent. I know that Goudie would have volunteered three years earlier if it had not been for his mother, who was in a state of senile decay of body

& mind, to which his devotion alone brought any relief, till her death. It would be a great favour, as well as serving the ends of justice, if you could kindly bring this matter to the notice of the right authorities. Knowing the difficulties of Coast travel from seven winters' experience, I should say a fair settlement would be an allowance of \$35.00 for each man for dog-team transport, & whatever rate of board & lodging a month you thought reasonable. Goudie, whom I trust, says he landed at Battle Harbour with \$130.00 & reached here with about \$40.00 That would be roughly a dollar a day for

On the road, they would certainly get some free hospitality, but I know they had to pay their teamsters as high as \$3.00 per day in some cases.

Michelin only lives 12 miles from here, so their expenses would be practically identical.

I am morally certain that they landed Battle Harbour on November 17th, 1918, & I know for an absolute fact that they reached home on January 27th, 1919.

This would make 71.00 each. But if you would chance an error of a day at Battle Hr., & sent them 70.00 on my statement, to avoid another year's delay, I can answer for it they would be well satisfied. Otherwise, would you agree to my satisfying their claims & you could refund me next summer.
