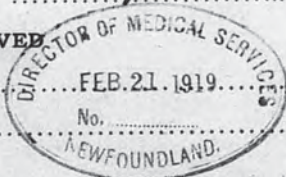



no doubt heard of the death of Pte Hudson, McKay and Lt Cheater who died during the month of April. Pte Hudson died on Apr 2nd and on Apr. 22nd Pte McKay passed away, whilst on Apr. 25th Lt Cheater joined his two comrades.

It cast a gloom over us Newfoundlanders, here, and we all are very sorry for their relatives at home, but from the first we had not much hope for either Hudson or McKay. but regarding Lt Cheater he was only sick about a month. Having returned from a working Kommando where he contracted a cold which ended in his death. All three died from consumption, and they

received a full military funeral they are buried side by side in the camp cemetery here and their graves are being looked after by the boys in the camp. A very fine cross has been placed on each grave, and a monument to the memory of the English soldiers buried here has been subscribed for by the prisoners here, and as soon as it has been erected I shall forward you a photograph of the graves. The other Newfoundlanders attached to this camp, with the exception of Corples Boody and McHellan are on working parties, and with one or two exceptions all employed on farms and from

latest reports, all are enjoying the best of health and are in regular receipt of their mail etc. Corples Boody and myself work on the English Postal Staff here, and so are in a position of keeping in touch with the boys. Again thanking you for your very kind interest on our behalf, I am.

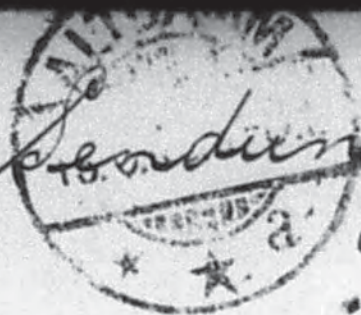

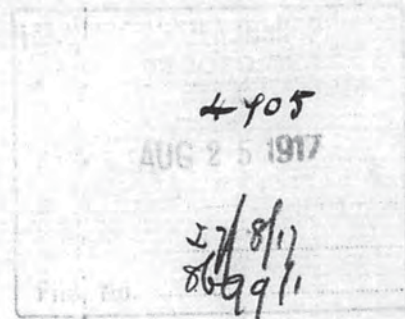



Dear Sir,

Your letter of July 30th reached me to-day and I am very sorry to hear that your son Lieut. Norman Outerbridge is reported wounded and missing since our attack on April 14th. Your son was in charge of No 15 Platoon, "D" Co. and I was in charge of No 14 Platoon, hence was in a position to see some of the morning's doings. My platoon went over the top in the first wave, we being the left of our battalion. Your son's platoon was in the second wave which would be about 30 to 40 yards behind mine. After we had advanced close on 300 yards our ranks had become considerably thinned. All our officers had been knocked out with the exception of Mr Norman, and he was wounded in the leg, he however did not flinch, but with the pluck and bravery becoming an English Officer he rallied the remainder of good old "D" Company and limping, he gallantly led us on our way. After progressing another 100 or 150 yds we received the full force of the enemy's machine gun fire, and were forced to take cover. On again rising and moving forward your heroic son was not with us and I concluded that his wound had become too much for him and that he had rested, however I did not see any more of him, and on being captured some time afterwards, I made enquiries of the men belonging to "D" Coy., but they could give no other information. Your son's actions on that memorable morning will for ever remain in the minds of those who were with him as his courage and perseverance inspired us all in the face of great odds, but our little band (we numbered scarcely ...) were eventually surrounded by the enemy and forced to surrender. During the day the Germans brought in many of our wounded and perhaps Lieut. Norman may be amongst the number. I trust such is the case and that you have heard better news ere now. There were of the Nfld Regt. captured unwounded. They are now distributed in various working camps and whilst at first conditions were not of the best they have vastly improved and we are becoming comfortable. In this camp with me are two other Nflds No. 523 Pte Smythe and 2214 Pte. Hudson. They work each day and are quite well. Sergts. and Corpis. do not work but are in charge of parties. I am in charge of 50 men who work at an electric plant and whilst the work is interesting it also helps to pass the time away. We are looking forward to receiving our parcels and we would be much obliged if the good people at home would send along some magazines or papers printed before the war. We are allowed to write two letters monthly and a postcard each week, so in case our people at home do not get news often they can understand matters.

Trusting you have received better news and hoping all our people at home are well and know of our whereabouts,

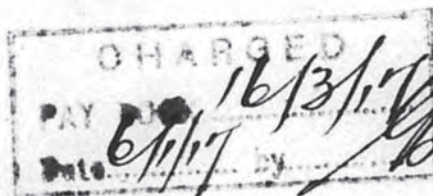

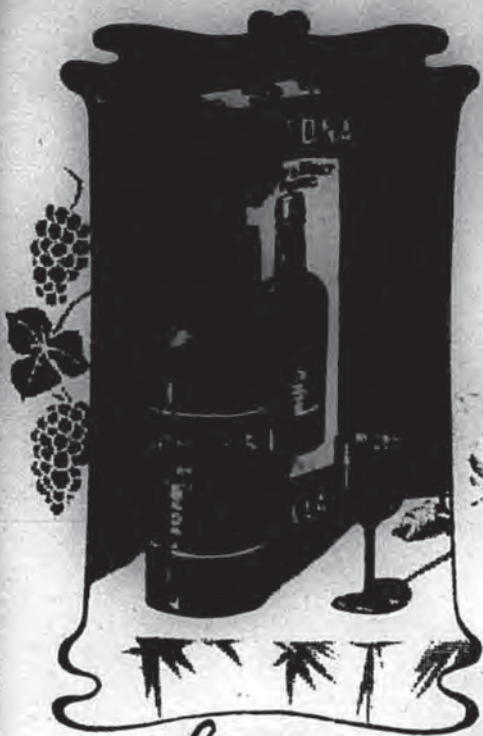



Dear Sir:

Your letters 9/3/18 - 1/5/18 and 10/5/18 reached me during the month and I thank you very much for same. With reference to your communication 9/3/18 I shall be very pleased if remittances can be continued monthly, also if you could arrange to have three hundred Players cigarettes sent out each month, having same charged to me, as we do not receive those parcels very regularly, we being now two months without a tobacco packet.

You have no doubt heard of the death of Ptes Hudson, McKay, and L/C. Cheater, who died during the month of April. Pte. Hudson died on April 2nd and on April 22nd Pte. McKay passed away, whilst on April 25th L/C. Cheater joined his two comrades. It cast a gloom over us Newfoundlanders here, and we all are very sorry for their relatives at home, but from the first we had not much hope for either Hudson or McKay, but regarding L/C. Cheater, he was only sick about a month, having returned from a working Kommando where he contracted a cold which ended in his death. All three died from consumption, and they received a full military funeral. They are buried side by side in the Camp Cemetery here, and their graves are being looked after by the boys in the Camp. A very fine cross has been placed on each grave, and a monument to the memory of the English soldiers buried here has been subscribed for by the prisoners here, and as soon as it has been erected I shall forward you a photograph of the graves. The other Newfoundlanders attached to this Camp, with the exception of Corpls Doody and McLellan, are on the working parties, and with one or two exceptions all employed on farms and from latest reports, all are enjoying the best of health and are in regular receipt of their mail, etc. Corpl. Doody and myself work on the English Postal Staff here, and so are in a position of keeping in touch with the boys. Again thanking you for your very kind interest on our behalf, I am,


Dear Mrs Moakler;

With reference to your inquiry about parcels to your son who is a prisoner of war in Germany, I have the honour to inform you that a wire has been received from the Pay & Record Office London, which states, "1766, Moakler had not received parcels up to 7, October." Sometime ago the complaints that had been received from the relatives of different men who are prisoners of war & the Pay & Record Office London, was instructed to have investigations set on foot at the War office to find out if possible the cause of the non-delivery of parcels. A report has been received of which was published a few days ago which indicate that the cause of non-delivery is traced to discrepancies on the part of the enemy. Prisoners taken on April 14, were not reported officially until July 20th. Parcels were immediately forwarded according to regulations but were not acknowledge and as many Canadians and men of English Regiments were also effected investigations had already been commenced. It is found that parcels had been packed and despatched regularly and the conclusion arrived at by the War Office is that the Germans were stealing the parcels and appropriating them for their own use. The English Government has taken the matter up with the Dutch Government and protest have

have been forwarded. The War Office advises that they hope to get satisfaction in this respect at once. When this report comes forward by mail it is hoped that the arrangements have already been made to overcome the dissatisfaction which has been prevalent.



Circumstances of Capture - I was Acting-Patrol Commander on the day and after we had gained our first objective and during the fighting ensuing when the Essex Regiment failed us, we found our flank Company, about 25 strong, on the extreme left and in the air. The Essex being counterattacked failed to hold on and surrendered, whereon we found ourselves outflanked and surrounded by a large force of Germans, who kept coming in masses in waves. Our little party was split up in shell holes, and being outnumbered to such an extent was captured.

Details of life and treatment during capture

I was unwounded and on being marched back we had to carry German wounded back to a dressing station about 2 kilometres behind the line. Then we went to a collecting stage where we met all the other prisoners of our Brigade. About 3.30 p.m. we left for Douai and stayed there for 5 days. We were fairly well-treated here, as they were trying to get information from us. From Douai we went to Lille, where we put into Fort MacDonald, 120 of us to a cell. The floor was of Concrete, there was no ventilation or sanitary arrangement. A puncheon in the corner did duty for a Latrine. We had to lie on the stone floor where we could, with no covering of any kind, and the place was reeking with filth and vermin. We were almost starved while we were there, as we were given only one slice of bread a day for food. I made a complaint on behalf of the men, but was told that our captors were going to retaliate on us for the way they said their prisoners were treated, and my efforts were of no avail, and conditions did not improve in the least.

On April 24th, 300 of us were shifted up towards the line on working parties, and were billeted in a barn in Marquien. This village was continuously under shell fire. We were two days in the village before we were given anything to eat; and then we were given a half loaf of ~~black~~ black bread. We were in this village until June 12th. We were used to build railways, dumps, and dugouts etc. The food was as scarce as ever, and we had to work 12 hours a day on a cup

of coffee in the morning, and a watery soup and some bread in the afternoon. We had no facilities for washing, our persons or our clothes at all. Our camp was a reprisal camp, and so we had to suffer accordingly, and quite a number of our party died from the effects of the hard work and privation.

We were then sent back to Douai on June 12th where we were given a bath and a chance to clean up. The food conditions were much the same as all along. The French inhabitants would try to smuggle food to us whenever possible. We were in Douai till October 20th, at working parties. We had received no parcels or mail from home as yet.

On November 27th, 1250 of us were sent to Germany and 650 of us, including 19 Newfoundlanders, were sent to Altdamm where we arrived on December 9th. On January 18th we got our first parcels from home. Our rations here were even worse than before in the matter of bread. Most of our men were put on farm work; the senior N.C.O's were given clerical work to do. I looked after the Commando branch of the Post Office.

Four Newfoundlanders died in this Camp - #1509 Mackie, #2214, Hudson and #3670 Cheater died more from the effects of their treatment than anything else, I am certain. Mackie and Hudson ~~and~~ died of consumption, and Cheater died of collapse after heavy work. Matford, the fourth, died of Influenza. We were here till the Armistice was signed and they sent us back to England via Copenhagen on November 30th and we arrived in England on December 14th.

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
