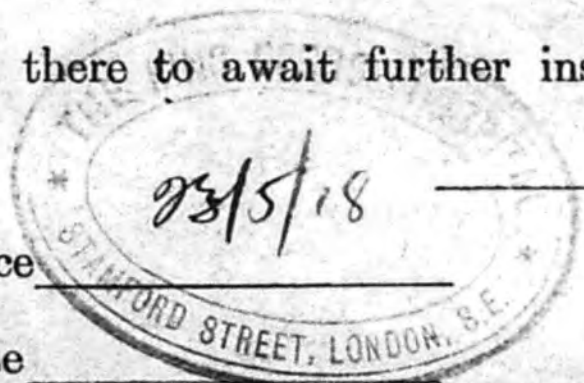

Notes.—(i.) 


