

Dear Sir:-

With reference to my capture by the Germans. On April 12/18 I was ordered to take up a position with my platoon in support of other troops of our Battalion behind the village of NIEPPE facing South. On my left were the Monmouths facing East. My platoon was dug in in three sects. I being with the left section which was the Lewis Gun Sect. The Germans attacked the Monmouths and they retired. I fearing that our troops in front of me would be cut off, remained firing my L. G. to prevent them coming down a road which was between me and the troops in front. When they had gone back. I gave the order to my men to withdraw I had not gone more than 10 yards when I was hit by a bullet passing through my neck which completely paralyzed me. as I could not speak or move, and did not move until picked up by the German some five or six hours later, and carried

into the village of Nippe.

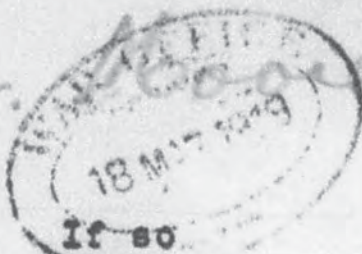

You remember the old Scottish command order about week end leave. Not to travel on Sat or Monday well that still holds good here so she will only give you leave (Week end) providing you don't travel by rail

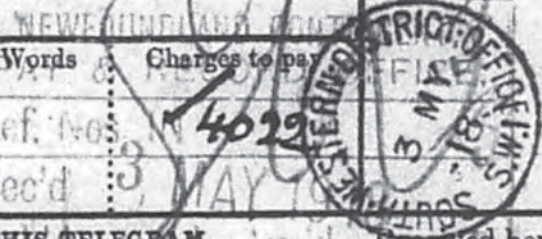

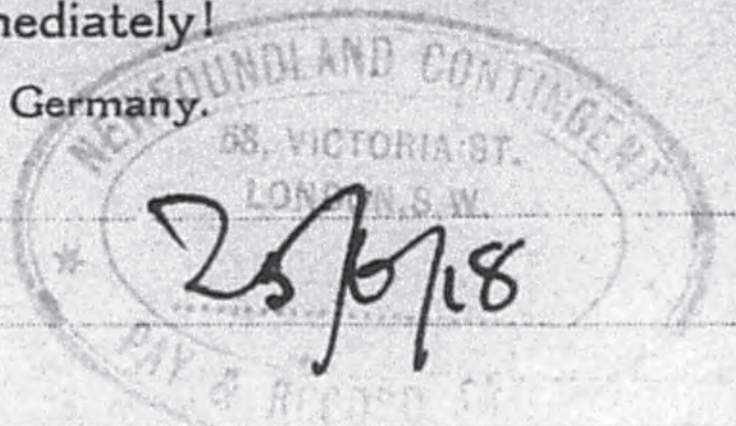

Your letter of 4th inst. has come to hand concerning 2/Lieut. Lorenzo Moore, Prisoner of War, and I beg to inform you that the address of this Officer is Ingolstadt, Bavaria, Germany.

With reference to your enquiry as to the Regulations governing the sending of Parcels to Prisoners of War, I might say that these regulations forbid any private person sending parcels to Prisoners of War. Three parcels per man per fortnight, containing food, clothing and groceries are sent by the N.W.C.A. But a new rule has lately been issued which permits the relatives to send an individual parcel every three months, having first procured a blue coupon from the Red Cross Society who issues them once a quarter. These quarterly parcels are not to weigh over 11 lbs.

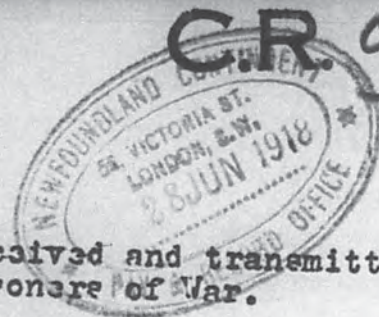

Major,

I have taken the engagement of writing to you about the Lieutenant Moore, taken as a prisoner of war in the battle of Armentieres at the beginning of April 1918. I have forgotten his christain name and some particulars (his age, approximately twenty five or twenty six) ~~but~~ he was from the New Found Land and I suppose you will be able to find all the necessary indications with your list.

He was cured in the hospital of Ingolstadt (Bavaria) for his wound in the same time I was there for illness, which made me sent in Switzerland. He ~~has~~ received a bullet in the neck, and probably the spine was touched; in result of this wound several parts of his body have become less or more insensible. One of his arms (the right, I think) and the right hand cannot be clasped, and are fast insensible; the lieutenant is quite unable to dress himself alone. He wants absolutely to be helped.

As, in spite of this, he was sent in a camp, (this of Karlsruhe, I think) he prayed me to make his case known in London, in order you may reclaim himself for Holland by the first commission for wounded.

I pray you, Major, to excuse me for all my faults in writing English and accept my distinguished salutation.



With reference to my capture by the Germans. On April 12/18 I was ordered to take up a position with my platoon in support of other troops of our Battalion behind the village of Nieppe facing South. On my left were the Monmouths facing East. My platoon was dug in in three Sects. I being with the left Section which was the Lewis Gun Sect. The Germans attacked the Monmouths and they retired. I fearing that our troops in front of me would be cut off remaining firing my L.G. to prevent them coming down a road which was between me and the troops in front. When they had gone back I gave the order to my men to withdraw. I had not gone more than 10 yards when I was hit by a bullet passing through my neck which completely paralyzed me, as I could not speak or move, and did not move until picked up by the Germans some five or six hours later and carried into the village of Nieppe,
