I have received your letter of the 26th inst about your son Sidney and in reply wish to state that L/C Morry came to me some little time ago and told me the circumstances of his position and how. at least, four of his brothers are in the service. I granted him leave of absence without Pay for 3 months.

He informs me that he does not wish to be released from the service altogether but owing to the circumstances of the case I granted him this leave.

He voluntarily enlisted and consequently it will be difficult to release him from the army. However, the question of extending his leave further will be considered if a request is made by him some time before 3rd December. He would not be liable for service overseas until he reaches ~~nineteen~~ the age of 19 years.

He should be examined by the travelling Medical Board before discharge, so that his state of health can be recorded, and he should also sign release, freeing the government from any future responsibility whatever in connection with him.
