This form when filled up must be delivered to the Clerk of the Borough, Urban District, or Rural District, in which your address is situated. For this purpose it may be posted in the ordinary course (postage being prepaid), or handed over the counter at a Post Office (if possible in the district of your permanent residence), and a certificate of registration will be forwarded to you in due course by the Local Registration Authority.

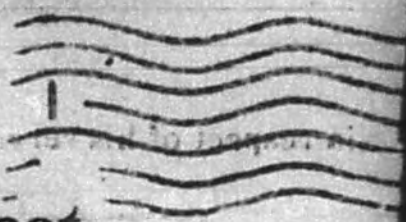
