It is regretted that in the case of Pte. Murphy that the blame and responsibility rests entirely with this Office.

This man was admitted to Wandsworth some days before the boat sailed (where he now is) and unfortunately steps were not taken to communicate with Wandsworth and find out if he was in a fit condition to travel.

The error is also regretted in view of the difficulties of transport facilities.

In the case of Pte. Fisher this man was granted Furlough to Ayr pending receipt of embarkation orders, he gave an address to which he did not proceed and consequently embarkation orders which were sent to him were returned unknown, after a few hours we were apprised of his correct address and fresh instructions were sent to him, and although report was received from the Embarkation Officer from Liverpool stating that he did

not proceed, another wire was received last night (from Embarkation Officer) stating that he had proceeded after all, this case therefore does not now arise.
