
Dear Mrs. Muttford,

Your daughter Miss Muttford called this afternoon with reference to the non receipt of letters and parcels by #2464 Pte. G. Muttford who is a prisoner of War in Germany. I informed her that no doubt she will inform you that it is not permissible for private parties to forward parcels owing to the War Office regulations now in force. Food parcels are despatched at the rate of three per fortnight to every soldier, as soon as he has been reported as a prisoner of war. It sometimes happens that the only address given is Limburg, in which case parcels and letters are detained at Limburg until the soldier has been sent to the registered concentration camp. I am forwarding copy of the regulations governing the sending of parcels to prisoners of War, and will be glad to give any information you may desire.

Dear Miss Noel,

I am returning herewith your field post-card from 2464, Pte. H.G. Nutford. Pte. Nutford states that he has not been receiving any letters and for your information I would state that a number of prisoners of war were not reported until more than two months after their capture, all letters were forwarded to them as soon as their capture was notified officially. It has been found on investigation that some of our prisoners were working behind the lines and their mail and parcels were not being forwarded regularly. Protests are lodged and it is hoped the difficulty have been overcome and that the prisoners are now receiving their mail regularly.
