EXTRACT from LECTURE by CAPTAIN T. NANGLE, C.F.,

in St. John's, Newfoundland

-----

. . . . . A man knows only what is happening in the immediate neighbourhood where he is, and on the whole it is almost impossible to place reliance upon any individual stories. In this case, however, the Commanding Officer sent out Kevin Keegan to reconnoitre the position.

He went across the battle-swept area, ducked the guns and the shells and the falling houses, and looking around saw the Germans coming along victorious. Keegan made everybody fall in, even the cooks, got sixteen men in all, and went down and reported to the General.

When Keegan reported to Forbes-Robertson, Forbes-Robertson replied, "Well, Keegan, we will go out ourselves and give them a little diversion," in the hope that reinforcements might be sent up.

They had no guns or ammunition, Keegan had only a revolver. Going through the village Robertson picked up a rifle off a dead soldier, from a cavalry man a bayonet was got, ammunition was picked off a dead private; and equipped in this manner out started the sixteen men to face the mass of Germans.

When they got to the edge of the village the sixteen men had been reduced to nine. Forbes-Robertson saw a grove of trees alongside, and the party established themselves in the grove. That was about 10 o'clock in the morning. That grove these nine men held until four o'clock. Every German that showed his head during these hours was shot. The Germans did not know that the place was held by nine men only. They thought there must be at least a division there.

The Germans sent out scouts to reconnoitre and report. Not a scout returned. Had one single scout discovered the situation the nine men would have been wiped out and the Germans would have advanced to victory. Not only would Monchy have been lost, but all the work for months would have been undone. There was nothing between the nine men and the first line of guns, nothing between the guns and the brigade headquarters. Had the Germans passed victoriously through Monchy they would have recovered back all that had been won in the Arras battle.

Lieut.-Col. Forbes-Robertson and these eight men are the men who saved Monchy. They won fame for themselves. They won fame for the Regiment. The whole British Army in France honours the names of these nine men for their heroic conduct. During the day they lived upon the scraps that could be picked up. They secured some bacon from the supplies carried by one dead man. They located a tin of lard and used it for butter. In one trench they got half a crock of marmalade, the other half being clay. The marmalade did not taste so bad at all after the clay was thrown out.

One doctor who established himself in a series of cellars, about five in all, moved from cellar to cellar as his headquarters were blown in, his only observation being, "It is my move." He won the M.C. that day.

As advised by cable Major Hangle is returning by S.S. "Sachem" due to sail tomorrow, Jan. 3rd. During his stay in this country he has given a report to the Prime Minister of the work done by him.

It is the wish of the Government that Major Hangle should represent them in connection with the work of Battle Exploits Memorial, Graves, Cemeteries, etc. in France, Belgium, Gallipoli and the United Kingdom. The High Commissioner will of course remain as the representative of the Government on the Imperial War Graves Commission, and he is being asked to co-operate with Major Hangle who will be designated "Director of Graves Registration and Enquiries, Newfoundland Contingent."

Major Hangle will communicate direct with this Department on routine matters, and will be the connecting link between the Department of Graves Registration and Enquiries and the Government represented by this Department. I should be glad if you will hand over to him the Death Register which you have in your Office, and such records dealing with graves, burials, cemeteries, memorials, etc. as he may require in carrying out his duties. He has referred to the 'Green Book' which you have, as a means of obtaining the addresses of the next of kin of deceased soldiers. I should be glad if you will allow him to use this book when he requires it, and would suggest that it be handed over to the High Commissioner when its use in your Department no longer exists, to enable Major Hangle to continue to have reference to it. As it is decided to have a central control in this matter, and as your Office will be closed when this work is still being carried on, I should be glad if you will discuss with Major Hangle the transferring to him your representations on the Brookwood Cemetery Committee.

The final report of the N.W.C.A. has just come to hand, and it is noted that they have passed over to the High Commissioner the balance of the funds at their disposal. A letter has been sent to the High Commissioner and also to the N.W.C.A. by the Colonial Secretary which I think will touch on this point.

Major Hangle will require the services of a clerk to carry out the office routine, more particularly when he is to be absent from London. If you can spare one of your staff in the near future, will you kindly arrange to have him transferred to his Office. Later when Major Hangle will be going to Gallipoli it is likely that he will require a man who knows that part to accompany him. It is the intention of the Government to erect a Memorial on the site known as "Caribon Hill". In order to have this site clearly defined, it is felt that one who has been out there would be invaluable. If you can arrange to have a suitable man to go with Major Hangle it would assist him in his work in this connection. The services of this man would be required only for the duration of the trip to and from Gallipoli

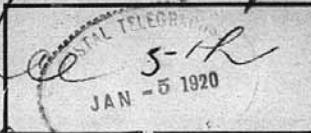

I should be glad if you will explain to Major Hangle that when he left this country some four months ago it was considered that the work that he was detailed to perform could be cleared up in six or eight weeks. His duties covered the collecting of isolated bodies and graves in France and Belgium into regimental military cemeteries. It is understood that he has since taken over work in connection with Wandsworth Cemetery and Brookwood Cemetery and that his work will likely continue for some months.

Under these conditions it has been thought advisable to place him on ordinary staff rates and to cease the special allowance.

It is hoped that the work that he has taken over in connection with these two cemeteries is proceeding smoothly in conjunction with the Committees handling these affairs prior to his arriving in the U.K. It would be unfortunate if there were any friction

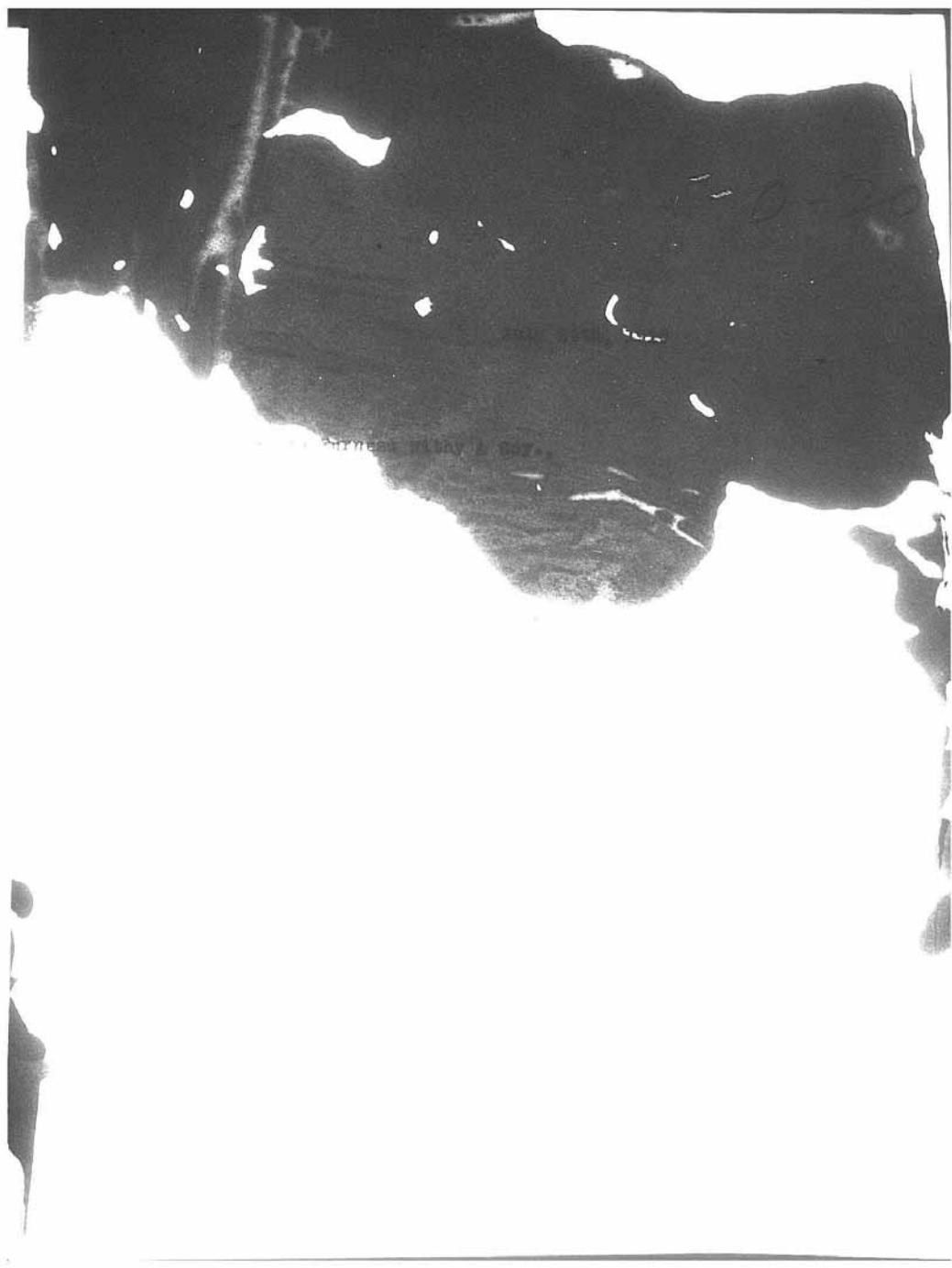

As seen by the Newfoundland Regiment.

Arras! It was late in the afternoon when we reached the place. We had been marching since 9 a.m. and were not sorry when the town came in sight.

We were not altogether surprised at its appearance. Everywhere were signs of the bombardment to which it was subject. The street-lines were plainly discernible and the framework of most of the buildings was intact, but they were all grim spectres of a French town within the area of war operations.

The Cathedral- beautiful suggestion of its architectural grandeur in days of peace- was a monument to Hun barbarity. The public buildings all bore traces of artillery work, as on every side one saw little else but shattered walls, empty window frames and piles of masonry.

The place was practically uninhabited. A few civilians came silently from cellars and shuffled down the shell-torn streets. They were pathetic in their loneliness and shrank even from contact with the Fommies who were delivering them from the terrors that had previously beset them.

English soldiers were everywhere- resting amongst the ruins, wandering around the streets or having tea. Our men were distributed

Anyhow, go on writing me d'ightful letters like the one I am now answering, with personal details for my own eye and another letter which I can publish in the local press. What we need here is some sympathetic news which will brighten up the homes and give the old people an idea of how the boys are spending these anxious years.



On arrival in this Country on Special Duty for the Newfoundland Government, I approached the various authorities and found I could carry out the work entrusted to me in a better manner if I gave up my present commission and was appointed under the Newfoundland Regiment. I was therefore demobilized from the Royal Army Chaplains' Department taking effect from the 2nd June, and suggest that I be gazetted to the Regiment from that date (with the rank promised, Major) and be appointed as

Director of Graves Registration & Enquiry,

2). As regards allowance, I wish you would ask the Department in Newfoundland to grant me the same expenses as those previously given to Draft Conducting Officers to this Country, and Officers on various duties, namely \$10.00 per diem. This may look big, but when one takes into account the high cost of living at Hotels, and continuous travelling about, the amount named will barely cover expenses. In France, now that the Officers' Clubs are closed, and it being impossible to draw rations, living will be much more expensive than previously.

3). For Sergeant Snow I recommend \$1.50 per day in London, as he may live quite well and cheap at a soldiers' hostel at that amount, and \$2.00 a day in France.

4). I hope to have a report ready to despatch in a day or two, please.

I have the honour to state that it is the desire of the Newfoundland Government that all isolated graves both registered and unregistered, of Newfoundland soldiers should now be traced and collected into the Military Cemeteries that are being organised. With this in view Major Thos. Nangle, C.F., who is at present in this country on leave without pay, has been employed by this Government to undertake the work. He is a Newfoundlander and for the last three years has been attached to the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, and has a personal knowledge of the location of many bodies and graves which have not been registered or which have been marked "location unknown".

The whole expense in connection with this work other than expenditures authorised by the War Office, and the Imperial War Graves Commission, will be borne by the Newfoundland Government.

The above mentioned Officer has been attached to the Royal Newfoundland Regiment for the past three years and is personally acquainted with the location of many isolated bodies and graves of Newfoundland soldiers which have not been registered.

It is the wish of the Newfoundland Government that all these should be collected into the Military Cemeteries that are being organised in France and Belgium. I have the honour to request that Capt. Hangle might be seconded for temporary duty with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment while employed on this special duty. It is the wish of the Newfoundland Government that he be paid from Newfoundland Funds and at Newfoundland rates. This procedure is acceptable to Capt. Hangle. THE TRAIL OF THE CARIBOULECTURE BY CAPTAIN (REV) THOMAS NANGLE C.F.

On Thursday the Rev Thomas Nangle who had made himself famous for his splendid work at the front as a soldier Priest of the Roman Catholic Church, lectured in the Casino Theatre. The Building was packed. Reserved Seats were sold out the day before the lecture, and a large number of people who depended upon securing seats at the last moment not only could not get them, but were unable to secure admission to the building.

Captain Nangle is a young man of fine soldierly bearing and has that fine clear ringing voice and positive manner which indicates the enthusiastic sincerity which he is putting into his work. His lecture was entrancing. There has been no public utterance in Newfoundland since the outbreak of the War which has gripped the audience as Captain Nangle's description of the bearing of our soldier lads in this, the greatest conflict of the ages.

For fifteen months Captain Nangle has been ministering as a soldier Priest to the Newfoundland boys in the battle line. He is now home on a few days furlough. On to-morrow he expects to start for his return journey to France. It would be quite impossible to frame words to faithfully represent the power of the personality of the man and his message.

STIRRING APPEAL

If Captain Nangle could be heard in the halls and schools throughout our Island, there would be few of military age and ability who would fail to respond to the Empire's call. The difficulties which have been in the way of recruiting in Newfoundland have been largely due to the lack of understanding of what this war means to Newfoundland and to the Empire. It is hard to think it possible that of the vast audience who listened to Capt. Nangle's lecture there will be a dozen men who can go to the front to take their place side by side with the heroes whose deeds have been inscribed on the scroll of Newfoundland's achievements, who will not, within the next month or two, place their names on the lists at the various recruiting stations in St. John's.

On September 24th, 1916, Captain Nangle first struck the trail of the Caribou. The fatal action of Beaumont Hamel was then over. Captain Nangle was but six miles from the spot, and wanted to get as near as possible to the place where our gallant boys had fought and fallen. Beaumont Hamel was then still in the hands of the enemy, but the fact that it involved danger to life and limb for Captain Nangle to go to the advance posts of the British meant nothing to a man of his character and courage.

"GALLANT LITTLE NEWFOUNDLAND"

When he completed his journey towards the extreme front he was met by the challenge of the Colonel of the Black Watch, who, noting him to be a stranger, wanted to know what he was doing there. But as he approached more closely the Colonel of the Black Watch saw "NFLD" on this shoulder strap, and immediately stepped forward, extending his hand with the words "Gallant little Newfoundland."

The fame of the doings of the Regiment in face of the fierce onslaught of the enemy, their gallantry in action, and indomitable courage, and the fortitude under which they bore up under adversity, made the name "Newfoundland" a synonym for gallantry and all the qualities which the soldier prizes most highly.

turned hero, had displayed the highest qualities of heroic soldiership, the man referred to was Frank O'Neil.

"HEROIC FRANK O'NEIL "

There was a number of Newfoundlanders standing together, of which O'Neil was one. A German bomb was thrown in their midst. There was no time to separate. O'Neil caught the bomb and was about to throw it back when it exploded, and to-day O'Neil is carrying in his body portions of its shell. That deed was worthy of a Victoria Cross.

Captain Nangle described graphically the scenes on the battle ground at Ypres. Few of the visitors, he said, ever tried to approach the front line of trenches, but one within his recollection did, and that was Major Paterson. At Ypres there was a corner known as "Suicide Corner." When one approached that corner he stops when about fifty yards away, tightens his belt and prepares to run as fast as he possibly can to get past the danger spot alive. When Major Paterson visited there, Captain O'Brien walked him up and down nine or ten times but no shell came over.

"GAINED MORE THAN THEIR OWN."

The lecturer next described the bombardment of Gueudecourt, on October 12th, the Newfoundlanders went over the trenches. Their success was the only success for the day. The Essex Regiment which were working on their left were repulsed and returned to their trenches without accomplishing their mission.

The Newfoundlanders, led by the indomitable Wesley March, Captain Bartlett, Capt. Butler and Lieutenants Edens and Clouston, not only gained their objective, but also took the objective which the Essex Regiment failed to secure.

The boys before going over the trenches took off their putties and stuck their long pants down into Newfoundland Socks, leaving their putties in the trenches. They went over the embankment with a yell. Some of them had on skin boots. One of the officers were blown in the air twelve feet high and came down again on his feet and continued on with the leadership of his men.

Edens had a narrow escape. A German came upon him within five yards and fired at him point blank. The bullet went between his arm and body, punching two holes in his tunic, his sweater and his shirt, but did not touch his arm itself. Before the German could draw his trigger again, Edens had dealt with him and there was one German less to fight.

"NEWFOUNDLANDERS' FIRST CHANCE "

The success of October 12th, was the first chance the Newfoundlanders had of meeting the German face to face in revenge for the defeat at Beaumont Hamel. The great achievement was not made, however, without its losses. Captain O'Brien, Capt. Donnelly, Lieutenant Clift, Lieut. Norris and Lieut. Edens fell that day, and the men of the Newfoundland Regiment swore that when another day of advance arrived these five men would be revenged, and that day came.

Shortly afterwards Captain Nangle met Lieut. Holloway. A true Soldier was Lieut. Holloway. A man who brought with him to the field of battle his knowledge of the rocks and woods of Newfoundland. Lieut. Holloway is no more, but his short career as a soldier was marked by many noble achievements. One of his first works and the most notable undertaking was his crawling from shell hole to shell hole with a tape, while under continuous enemy fire, making a plan of the land in front.

The Newfoundland Regiment did not mind how hard they worked or their privations or difficulties, provided they could get a rest and their hope was fulfilled. They were quartered

The vote of thanks was proposed by Doctor Lloyd and seconded by Sir William Horwood. His Lordship Bishop Power expressed his disappointment of His Grace Archbishop Roche at his inability to be present to pay honor to the Soldier-Priest, and express his personal regret at the departure of their Excellencies. He also extended his hearty congratulations to Bishop-Elect White on the high honor which had been conferred on him.

I should be glad if you will explain to Major Nangle that when he left this country some four months ago it was considered that the work that he was detailed to perform could be cleared up in six or eight weeks. It is understood that he has since taken over work in connection with Wandsworth Cemetery and Brookwood Cemetery and that his work will likely continue for some months.

Under these conditions it has been thought advisable to place him on ordinary staff rates and to cease the special allowance.

It is hoped that the work that he has taken over in connection with these two cemeteries is proceeding smoothly in conjunction with the Committees handling these affairs prior to his arriving in the U.K. It would be unfortunate if there were any friction

The above mentioned Officer has been detailed by this Department with the sanction of the Government to undertake the work in France and Belgium of marking and having registered the isolated graves and bodies of Newfoundland soldiers and of having them collected into the Military Cemeteries.

A letter has been addressed to the Chaplain General's Department asking that Capt Nangle be seconded for duty with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment for this special work and that he be given the acting rank of while so employed. The Chaplain General's Department has been requested to notify you of their sanction of this and I shall be glad if you would at once cable this Office.

Capt. Nangle should be noted for pay ex-Newfoundland Funds with effect from July 2nd at the rate of Captain, and if his acting promotion is approved, at the rate of Major from date of approval.

Capt. Nangle is authorised to make the necessary expenditure in connection with the satisfactory carrying out of this work for which he will render statements to you. Letters have also been addressed to the Secretary War Graves Commission, the Director of Graves Registration and Enquiries, and to the Commission Nationale des Sepultures Militaires, asking their assistance and co-operation.

Capt Nangle has instructions to report progress periodically and he will send his reports to you by transmission. Any important features are to be telegraphed, please, to avoid delay.

1. Capt. Nangle duly arrived and has been provided with the requisite accommodation in this office, and also documents etc. regarding matters of which he is taking charge.


