

Declaration made by 1032 Pte. C. Noftall Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

Enlisted January 29th 1915

Proceeded Overseas March 20th 1915.

Company in France: "B"

Where Captured: Monchy le Preux

Date: April 14th 1917

Circumstances surrounding capture:

During the attack I was wounded in the head, left arm and hip. The wound in my head caused me to become unconscious and on coming to my senses two Germans were standing over me, and being in a very weak condition there was nothing else for me to do but surrender.

Details of life and Treatment while in Captivity: I was taken prisoner about 10 a.m. on the 14th and with one other man was left on the sunken road, running about east from Monchy le Preux, until about 8 O'clock that evening. I was then taken to Douai and put in Hospital there and my wounds attended. The treatment here was very good, but the food was bad. From Douai I was taken to Doullman Camp. This was supposed to be a rest Camp, but instead of resting we were kept working very hard all the time and the food was miserable, consisting of one piece of black bread per day which we received at 5 p.m., with the exception of coffee which we received at 6 a.m. and barley water at 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. in very small portions, was the only thing we had to eat for the 24 hours. This continued for six weeks when the parcels began to arrive from England which came regularly every week after. From Doullman I was taken to Broushousen to work on a farm. The work here was very hard, but the treatment was fairly good, and with the parcels of food stuffs from England added to my rations I was fairly well off. I was here for four months, then I was taken to Mannheim for a Medical Board. The object of the Board ^{was} to see if I was fit to stay in Germany or otherwise, but I was pronounced fit, and sent to Highburgh. There was very little work done here. Some days we were sent to work in a stone quarry. I was kept here for about

a month and was then sent to Bodman and employed cutting wood. The treatment was very good. I stayed here for fourteen days when 2431 Pte. P. Conran and myself escaped and we managed to get within one kilometre of Switzerland when we were re-captured and taken back to Singer and put into prison there for three days, then we were taken to Highburgh and spent seven more days in prison with one small piece of bread and water for a days rations. From here I was taken to Scheltag to work on a farm. I was treated fairly good here but the work was hard with long hours - from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. I was kept 9 months here, or just until after the armistice was signed.

About 12th December I left Germany and landed at Dover on 16th December.
