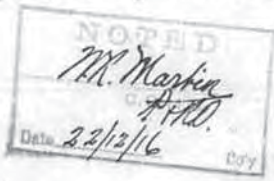

With reference to attached correspondence; when I was in St John's recently, Mr Noseworthy brought the matter to my notice when I agreed to look into it on my return to this country. Through various more or less unavoidable causes the matter has laid in obedience.

It will be observed by C.L.19., issued by this office, a copy of which is enclosed, in storing baggage no responsibility whatever is accepted. I have closely questioned those concerned and attach the report of 2/Lt. Burt.

The storeroom concerned is in the basement of this block, and was obtained with some difficulty. As a matter of fact a similar complaint was made by another officer, and although detectives were employed, nothing was ascertained by them.

As naturally I have no power to entertain such a claim, the alternative would appear to be to submit the matter to you for what action you may deem necessary.

The storeroom concerned is in the basement of this block, and was obtained with some difficulty. As a matter of fact a similar complaint was made by another officer, and although detectives were employed, nothing was ascertained by them.

As naturally I have no power to entertain such a claim, the alternative would appear to be to submit the matter to you for what action you may deem necessary.
