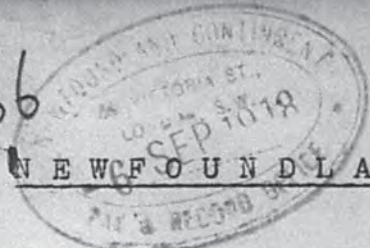



I beg to acknowledge receipt of yours of 28th inst. In reply thereto I beg again to state that the mistake lies not in my service but in your record of them. I admit that I was a member of the 2nd Battalion until the date you mention though as mentioned in my letter to you of the 18th inst I had been as a Draft Conducting Officer serving in a Theatre of War on several occasions previously during 1918.

It seems to me somewhat unreasonable that Officers serving with the Field Forestry Corps should be given the "highest rank" held while overseas in connection with the British War Medal while

an officer serving as I mention
with the Royal Field Regt. should
not be considered as such in
regard to the same medal.

These medals I presume to be intended
as an everlasting record and acknowl-
ment of services rendered
under the circumstances than I

to refuse a medal which places

In reply to your letter of Oct. 29th. I beg to say that the Regulations quoted in my recent letter are drawn up by the War Office and we have no power to alter their decisions. I quote hereunder an Extract from 'Notes on the Administration of the 1914-15 Star, British War and Victory Medals' which read as follows:"

(c) Draft Conducting Officers -- The 1914-15 Star and Victory Medal 'will be granted only to those Draft Conducting Officers who were gazetted or duly appointed as such and who landed in a theatre of war in charge of a draft within the specified dates of the Army 'Orders concerned'.

The Royal Newfoundland Regiment never had a Gazetted or specially appointed Draft Conducting Officer at any period during the war. Officers of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment who conducted drafts to the various theatres of war on one or more occasions are classed by War Office as temporary draft conducting officers and are ineligible for the Victory Medal.

I might say that the feelings that you express in your letter with regard to the Forestry Corps personnel are felt ~~by~~ not only by yourself but also by every individual of the Regiment, and case after case can be mentioned wherein a member of the Forestry Corps is always one better than the equivalent rank

I regret to report that 2nd Lieut: M. Nugent, now serving in the Battalion under my command, is not in my opinion suited for his present employment.

This Officer served in the ranks of the 1st Battalion of the Regiment in Gallipolis, ^{and later} ~~from which place~~ he was invalided ^{while in} to Egypt, and he subsequently followed his Battalion to France, where he was classified for Permanent Base duty. He returned on leave to Newfoundland in 1917, and while at home was appointed to a Commission in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, and joined the 2nd Battalion for duty on the 1st January last.

He has now been under my command, and observation for the past four weeks, and I am satisfied that he has carried out his duties to the best of his ability, and with the utmost good will, but he lacks the energy and activity which are so absolutely essential to an Officer of his rank, while his lack of knowledge of Drill and of Military subjects generally render him incapable of assisting his Company Commander in the training of the young Soldiers now being prepared in this Battalion to take their places in the fighting line in France. Referring to the subject matter of a communication dated April 25th, 1917 and addressed by Sergeant M. J. Nugent, with the verbal assent of his Commanding Officer, to the Chairman of your Committee, the Sub Committee appointed to deal with the question beg to report as follows:-

In conjunction with representatives of the Finance Committee we enquired into and considered the matters referred to in the communication above mentioned.

The system of separation allowances obtaining in Canada does not apply here. The local system of supplementing pay in deserving cases out of the Patriotic fund is satisfactory and sufficient.

Our enquiries have failed to substantiate the correctness of the figures quoted by Sergeant Nugent as regards the new scale of pay for members of the Royal Naval Reserve. So far as we can learn it is not the intention to have the pay of the Reservists, including all allowances, exceed that of the members of the Regiment. The idea of the change of the rate of pay for the Naval man is merely to make his total pay equal to the total pay of the man in the Regiment.

We have to recommend that:-

- I. The substance of this report be communicated in writing to the Officer Commanding at Headquarters in St. John's with a copy thereof for transmission by him to Sergeant Nugent.

2. It ought to be distinctly understood that Sergeant Nugent's letter should have come before your Committee through the Officer Commanding and not merely with his permission verbally given, though we do not blame Nugent for this.
3. The fact that your Committee has considered the matter is not to establish any precedent but the procedure outlined in the last preceding paragraph must, in all cases arising hereafter, be strictly conformed to.

Sir:-

I have the honour to forward you a short statement regarding the position of married men in the Regiment. I notice that the Government have increased the pay of R.N.R. by seventy cents per day, and have thus brought them up to what is supposed to be the pay of the members of the Regiment. As a matter of fact the Navy men, under the new scheme will be paid considerably more than the men of the Regiment, especially the married men.

We are supposed to be governed by the system in use in the Canadian Army, but as far as I can see this ends in the supposition. The Canadians are granting separation allowances to their married men of \$20.00 per month and upwards according to rank. Whether the sum is governed by the number in family I am not at present aware.

As far as the matter goes in England they are governed by the number in family.

Now Sir, regarding the pay of the Naval Reservists I beg to state that they have my best wishes for all they can obtain but at the same time, the people seem to be under the impression that they have been badly treated.

The scale of pay as stated with the additional amount of 70 cents brings them up to \$1.10 per day or \$7.70 per week. The separation allowances are for a married man if he leaves \$1.20 per week to his family. Wife only \$1.46, Wife and one child \$2.92. Wife and two children \$4.01: Wife and three children \$4.86 Wife and four children \$5.34.

Thus you can see that a married man in the R.N.R. with a wife and four children gets, - if he leaves \$1.46 per week, - \$13.04 per week, whereas the same man in the Regiment gets \$7.70. Besides this a great many of our Navy men will draw a considerable amount of prize money, amounting in some cases to hundreds of dollars. The married men in the Army (and there were some even in the first five hundred) leave a certain allotment to their families. This is all they are in receipt of, "Simply that and nothing more."

I write this in no spirit of carping criticism, because I for one am satisfied to do my duty while the war lasts, and for which I signed on at Aldershot. Still I think the few married men in the Regiment should be placed on the same footing as the married men in the Navy. As the matter stands the married man of the Navy with a wife and four children or the private even of the British Army, under the same conditions receives more pay than the sergeant of the Newfoundland Regiment. These separation allowances are also paid to a mother or father dependant upon a soldier.

Trusting your committee will receive this communication in the spirit in which it is sent.

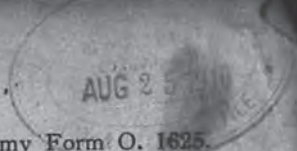


