

Dear Madam:-

The Military Medal so gallantly won by the above named soldier has now come to hand and I should be glad to know your wishes with regard to having this medal presented. If you would like this medal sent to you by registered post, your wishes will be complied with, but I should prefer to have the medal presented publicly. If you will agree to that arrangement I shall be glad to make arrangements with the Justice of the Peace of your district for a public presentation.. I shall be glad to hear from you at an early date, and I can then let you know the date and place on which the presentation will take place.

I have great pleasure in quoting the extract of the deed for which the medal was awarded.

"In the attack on the enemy near Langemarck on 16th August 1917, as company stretcher bearer during the advance showed great bravery and devotion to duty in bringing back wounded to the dressing station at Ruisseux Farm. He personally took charge of the company stretcher bearers and had all cases cleared very promptly."
