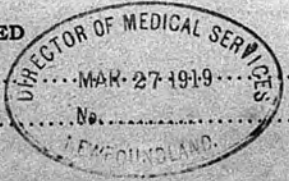

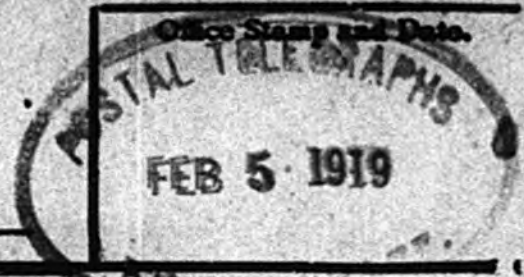

Sir:-

I have the honour by direction to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 14, Jan. The letter and the parcel forwarded by you have been received. The letter will be forwarded to the Record Office, London, who will transmit it to Pte. Osmond's address in Germany. I am returning the parcel to you as owing to the regulations adopted by the Imperial Authorities it is not permissible for private parties to forward parcels to prisoners of war in Germany. Parcels are packed and despatched by the Newfoundland War Contingent Association, acting under direct supervision of the Central Prisoners of War Committee which is the authorized committee for dealing with all matters pertaining to Prisoners of War. I expect you have seen the regulations governing the despatch of parcels to Prisoners of War which have been published in the local press. These regulations still hold good without alteration. If your parcel were forwarded it would not get any further than London and it would either be opened and distributed in the hospitals or returned to this department.

The arrangements now in force are the outcome of negotiations between the Imperial and the German Authorities. I regret therefore that your request to forward this parcel cannot be complied with. If you are not aware of the regulations I should

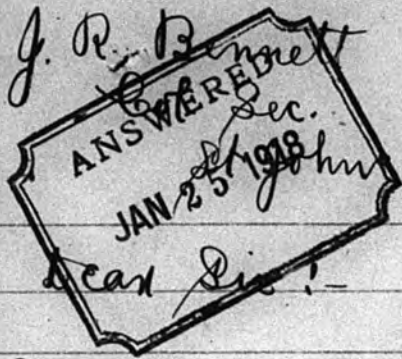
