

Circumstances Surrounding Capture

While advancing on enemy lines on the morning of April 11, 1917. I was wounded in the right arm and both legs, this was about 11 am of the same day, being completely knocked out. I lay in the open exposed to fire from 11 am until six o'clock that afternoon, when I was found by a German soldier, and taken to a small village behind the lines.

Details of Life and Treatment under Capture

After being taken to this village I was put in a Church where I found three or four Newfoundlanders who had been taken that day. I remained here that night, next morning I was sent on to Danai where I was put in hospital, while at this hospital I was operated on which proved very painful as there was no chloroform, our food while here consisted of soup and bread. Remained in this hospital for ten days, after which I was taken into Germany to a place called Danstadt, where I was

Again put in hospital where I was kept for
eight months. Treatment here was very rough.
My wounds were only bandaged once a week
and then with paper bandages, the food
was even worse than that received at Davao.

After leaving Danstett I was taken
to a place called Mandeme, here I was
re-medically examined to see if my wounds
were bad enough to have me repatriated to
Switzerland, but not being considered bad
enough I was kept in Mandeme for two
months. From here I was taken to Waldsloh
where I was put on a farm. I received fair
treatment from this farmer, but the work
was very hard, being kept going from
3 am until late at night. My food consisted
of a bowl of soup and a slice of bread for
breakfast, dinner, and tea. I worked
on this farm for six months which ran
into December, 1918, about a week before
Christmas of the same year all prisoners
of war in this town were collected together
by a German soldier, when we were
marched about thirty miles to a large
town and put aboard a train and taken
to Alsace Lorraine and handed over to
French authorities, here we remained in
hickets for three days, when I was sent

to an American hospital with "flu".
Remained in this hospital five days.
When I was sent on to Calais where I
embarked on a hospital ship for Dover
England where I arrived in the latter
part of December '18

With reference to your letter 6/7/17 (4018): it is thought that possibly since you wrote you will have received certain information with regard to what is done here for Prisoners of War. From time to time correspondence on the subject generally has been exchanged between the Hon. the Colonial Secretary and this office, and if you have not already done so, it is suggested that you apply at the office of the Colonial Secretary.

The enclosed N.Fs. P 65 and 73 will briefly indicate the procedure, which is of course governed by the rules and regulations that may be in force from time to time. In some cases direct notification has been received from Prisoners, whilst in others the news has come through other sources: hence the two forms to meet either case.

Letters can either be sent direct, in accordance with the last notified address, or be forwarded to this office for transmission. The latter may be more effective, since changes of address may take place, and not be known to you in time.

It should be borne in mind that lettees may be lost in transit to Germany and vice versa, which possibility is emphasised by experience.



Your card received a few days ago and I take this opportunity of thanking you for the interest you are taking in our welfare, here at this Camp.

There are only three Mfld. boys actually in the camp at present, Sgt. Moakler, Cpl. McLellan and myself. The others are all working in different districts. We hear from them often through chaps coming back to the Camp. They are all quite well and receiving their parcels alright.

No doubt you have heard ere this that three of our chaps died here in less than a month, Hudson, Mackay and Cheator. We visited them often during their illness and did all we could under the circumstances to help them. They are buried in the camp cemetery and a subscription is being raised in the camp to erect a monument to their graves.

I wrote some time ago to the Association asking for cap and collar badges, shoulder titles, and regimental buttons, but have not received them up to date. I would be greatly obliged if you would take the matter in hand and have them forwarded. Our cigarette supply is also very unsatisfactory when I tell you that I have only received two cigarette parcels for thirteen months you will see for yourself. Again thanking you for past favours and hoping to hear from you in the near future.

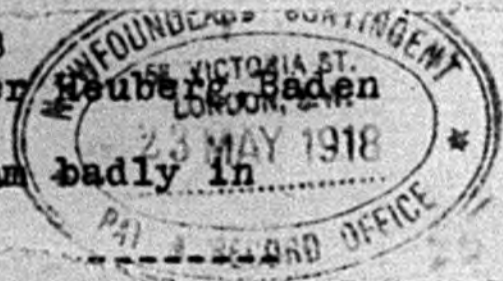



I HEREBY CERTIFY that I have had an interview with the Vocational Officer of the Civil Re-establishment Committee or other recognized vocational agent of the Committee who has explained to me the provisions made by the Committee for the industrial re-training of disabled or partially disabled sailors and soldiers as well as the readiness of the Committee to assist any returned sailors and soldiers (whether disabled or not) to find employment. My decision is as follows:
