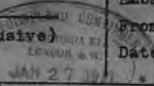



With regard to the marginally noted man. This man is on the Strength and therefore technically does not come under the perview of the Pensions & Disabilities Board. Dr. Fraser, I take it, considers that he represents them on the Standing Medical Board but this should apply only to the Boards dealing with pensioners, or the estimation of disability in cases for discharge.

I think the question very fairly dealt with in D. O. C's communication to you of November 30th. In his communication of December 10th. the last paragraph is dealing simply with confusion of terms. When Dr. Fraser in his letter says "Complete Rest" he probably means "cessation of military duties."

I quite agree with D. O. C. that experience has shown the terms to be anything but synonymous and that a man recommended for "furlough" is not necessarily at "complete rest."

R. S. M. Peckham is now in the Naval & Military Convalescent Hospital, having been admitted there on the occurrence of the first vacancy following the recommendation of the Medical Board.



I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 4, Dec., referring to the case of 909, R.S.M., H. Peckham. I would respectfully point out that this man is on the Strength of Headquarters Unit and therefore technically does not come under the purview of the Pensions & Disabilities Board, who deal with pensioners and men for discharge. It is noted that this man was before the standing Medical Board on the 1, Dec., 1917, and was recommended for six months furlough no reference being made to complete rest or treatment. He was again before a Standing Medical Board on 28, Aug., and was recommended for three months furlough with complete rest no mention being made of treatment. His third Board held on the 29, Nov., recommended complete rest at Naval and Military Convalescent Hospital and this recommendation was carried out.


R.S.M., Peckham was admitted to the N S M.C., Hospital on the occurrence of the first vacancy following the above recommendation. Instructions have been issued to the proper Military Authorities that in all cases recommendations of the Medical Board are to be carried out. For your

Information. I would observe that it has been represented to the standing Medical Board that the Military Authorities cannot control the soldier's actions at night when he is on furlough. In all cases where Hospitals, Sanitoriums or convalescent home treatment has been recommended steps have been taken to have these recommendations carried out.







I have your memo of 30th ult. In accordance with procedure the report of the Medical Board, would be sent to the O.C. Depot, who would instruct the soldier in question to report to the D.M.S. I have ascertained that this has been done.

With reference to previous boards. This man was before the Standing Medical Board on February first, 1917. The board recommended that he be given six months furlough, without any reference to complete rest or treatment. This simply meant that the man was to go free, on full pay, having no especial responsibility to any one, and being under no observation or control of any kind. After loafing around for some time, this man said he would like something to do, and was sent across with a draft to England, it being thought that a sea trip would benefit him. The duties performed by the soldier called for no exertion, and he probably had more rest and was under better control, than when on furlough. His second board was held on August 28th, when he was recommended for three months furlough with complete rest. This three months furlough was carried out. I would point out, however, that it was impossible to give the man three months furlough,

and at the same time guarantee that he would have complete rest, as when on furlough he was under no control. During this period of furlough he went across with another draft, under similar conditions, as above described. I am not conversant with the circumstances under which he went, as I was absent from the Colony on duty, at the time.

His third board was held on November 29th, and he was recommended for complete rest at the H & M Convalescent Hospital, and was ordered to report as above noted, to the D.M.S. for disposal.

I would respectfully observe that if the intention of the Medical Board, when recommending furlough, was that the soldier should have complete rest, the object aimed at, in my opinion was not achieved by such recommendation. The soldier in this case becomes responsible to no authority, and is at perfect liberty to commit any excesses, and eat anything that suits him. My attention has frequently been called to Dysentery cases, in which furlough has been recommended, where the officers and soldiers concerned, attend parties and dances drive around at all times of the day and night in automobiles etc, and otherwise conduct themselves so as to make it seem doubtful if the recommendations of the Medical Board in such cases, were the best solution of the problem.

I would further respectfully submit, that the duties performed by R.M.S. Peckham in going overseas with drafts, could hardly possibly do him more harm, than being allowed to do what he liked, and act as he liked, as the result of the recommendation of the Medical Board. I suggest that the recommendation of the last board is the only proper one that has been made to meet the circumstances of the case, if complete rest is the desideratum. I have discussed this matter with the D.M.S., who I think, understands the position.





Dear Sir:-

I would like to call your attention to the case of Sergeant-Major Peckham, who returned here some months ago suffering from the effects of illness contracted at Gallipoli. The Standing Medical Board has recommended, on three different occasions, that he be given complete rest, but on each occasion this recommendation has been disregarded, and he has been put on light duty or sent to England with drafts of men. I think it only fair to point out that, if our recommendations are disregarded, this man's condition may get so much worse that he may become a permanent charge on the Colony; and therefore I think some steps ought to be taken to see that the recommendation of complete rest be carried out for him for some time to come.
