Dear Sir,

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a cable from the Record Office, London, reporting that your son, L. Corp. Richard Poddle, had been killed in action on December 5th.

Permit me to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, sincerest sympathy in your time of sorrow. But though we feel the parting and though the heart is heavy with its loss, yet it is a glorious thing to think that your gallant boy early responded to the call of duty and made his stand for the establishment of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty upon the earth. We are all proud of our brave and noble boys but no less do we esteem the unselfish fathers and mothers who so willingly gave their boys when the call of duty came. Though your boy has laid down his earthly weapons he wears the soldier's Crown of Victory and his name is inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow countrymen. When the end of this war comes and an honourable and abiding Peace will have been established, it will be your proud thought that your dear boy did, to the utmost of his ability, to bring about ~~that~~ result.

I trust that the Great Father of us all may give you of his love and comfort at this time.



Dear Fr. Finn;- 2637. Corp. Richard Peddle.

With reference to the matter you spoke to me about at Grand Falls.

I have made inquiries into same and find that the facts are as follows;-

This soldier did not make any allotment at all. I understood from you that he had made an allotment to his father, but there is no trace of same here, and I shall be glad if you can give me any further particulars about this.

I enclose copy of letters written to Mr. Peddle under dates of March 3rd. and April 9th.

Under the Pensions' Act the pension is only payable to a dependent of the deceased soldier. The best proof of dependence is the fact the soldier during his lifetime made an allotment to such dependent. If he did not do this the Pensions' Board assume that as the relative did not receive any portion of the soldier's pay, while

he was alive, there is no reason why he should be considered a dependent after death, unless it can be shown that he was in receipt of money from the son in other ways.

In order, therefore, for Mr. Peddle to have a claim for pension he would have to establish to the satisfaction of the Pensions' Board, that he was actually in receipt of assistance from his son.

These are the particulars as far as I can obtain them, and if there is any further information you require I shall be happy to be of service.


