NOTES.—(i.) Re 3845, ExPte. Raymond Felley.

I have for reply your letter of Feby. 6th., which arrived here this AM.

Pte. Felley will have to be treated as an Ex-Imperial settler. That means that if he has not had previous agricultural experience, and he applies to us for the benefit of the Soldier Settlement Act, we can grant him that benefit after he has taken two years' training with a successful practical farmer in the Maritime Provinces.

If he wishes to go anywhere else in Canada, he is quite at liberty to do so, and he will find on the back of the Hand Book which I am enclosing, the different District Offices of the Soldier Settlement Board, and whatever district he may wish to settle in, he would have to apply to the District Superintendent there.

This period of two years may be lessened to one year if he has had agricultural experience in Newfoundland or elsewhere.

To obtain the benefits of the Soldier Settlement Act, he would have to be able to put ten percent of the purchase price of the property that he wishes us to purchase for him, and have enough money to maintain himself until the farm he is located on would become productive.

I am enclosing you two copies of our Hand Book, one of which I would like you to retain in case you may be asked similar questions in the future, and the other I wish you would forward to Mr. Felley. This Hand Book will show you what financial assistance we give, terms of repayment, and the method of procedure.

I trust that this is satisfactory information for you.
