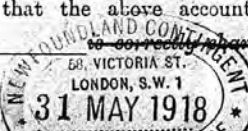

Dear Mr. Squires:-

I am in receipt of a letter dated Jan. 16th from the Board of Pension Commissioners, in reply to my request for a statement of the case of No.431 Private B. Piercey. On Dec. 2nd you forwarded me a letter from Mr. Isaac Piercey of Hopcull, T.B., the father of this soldier, which I am now returning in order that you may reply thereto.

With reference to this case, I am informed by the Pensions Board that the case of this man came before the Board of Pension Commissioners on Jan. 15th, and as it was shown that he was a man of fifty years of age with an average income of \$600.00 per year, he cannot be classed as a dependent. Under the regulations, therefore, a pension cannot be granted.

With reference to Mr. Piercey's statement that others are still receiving their allowance the Pensions Board inform me that no person at the present time is receiving allowance for a son who was killed previous to Dec. 1917 except some specially considered cases, and then to avoid actual hardship.

With reference to the continuation of allowance referred to, I would state for your information that in certain cases where a soldier made his allotment payable to a parent, and the soldier became deceased while on service, the old Pensions and Disabilities Board requested this Department to continue the payment of the allotment until the formation of the permanent Board of Pension Commissioners. This allotment was so continued on account of any pension that might be payable, and the amount so paid from the date of death of the son to the cessation of payment at the request of the Board of Pension Commissioners, is refunded to this Department by the Pensions Board. If that Board finds that no pension is payable, they do not take any steps to recover the allotment so paid, and they inform the next of kin concerned that no further payments are being made. If a pension is payable, the account is of course adjusted from the date of death of the son

to the date on which the pension comes into effect; that is, any difference due to the next of kin is paid in a lump cheque, and the pension comes into force from that date; the amount of allotment paid being refunded to this Department as already explained.
