Dear Sir :-

Our Mr. F . P . Pike, MANAGER of our company, enlisted for service in THE ROYAL N'F'L'D. REGIMENT, we think, on the 18 th inst of April. He is, as you will notice in his report "in the twenties and has been anxious to do his bit the past two years, but we always held out that he was doing justice to his country by doing the work in the capacity as MANAGER of this business. He started with the company when it started business some ten years ago, and has been working in the capacity as MANAGER the past six years, and if he is taken we will find it difficult to place him.

We might say for your information, that last May we acceded to the request of GOVERNOR DAVIDSON in letting of the Manager of our NORRIS ARM branch, Mr. W.H. Baird, now MAJOR BAIRD of the FORESTY BATTALION, and since that time our Mr. Pike has been doing his work, as well as all outside work at this end, having to make fortnightly trips up to that branch.

We might also add, that at the time Mr. Pike offered for enlistment, things were looking rather serious as far as the standpoint of men was concerned, and he brought this to our notice, and as patriotic citizens we could not at this time stand in his way, but since then CONSCRIPTION has been brought into effect, and we notice quite a lot of men are forth-coming.

We enclose herewith an exemption form filled in as best we know how, and would be pleased if you will bring same before the proper authorities and advise us immediately, as we understand Mr. Pike is to report on either June the 1st or the 4 th. If you cannot see your way clear to grant him total exemption, we would appreciate an extension of time for 4 or 6 months to tide us over the busy season at NORRIS ARM, which as stated before, our Mr. Pike has been handling since our Mr. Baird left.

We would ask your careful consideration of the above, and we know that you are busy people just now, but would thank you for a reply at the earliest possible moment.

Dear Sir :-

When speaking to you personally last week regarding a further extension of time, you asked me to write you up a letter stating my reasons for asking for a further extension, also stating as to the extent of time needed.

In doing this, I wish to state that I am the only support of a widowed mother and invalided brother. My father being dead for five years and my brother has been "TUBERCULOR" the past four years and has had to undergo some four or five operations, but although he has undergone all this, he was able to put in about six months working the latter part of last season, and in APRIL last was taken down with appendicitis and has been in his bed ever since. It was while my brother was at the general hospital to undergo this operation that the appeal for men was so strong and seemingly so scarce, and acting upon the understanding from the doctors that it was only a matter of time when he would be able to take up duties again, that I decided to do my bit, at this time I did not take my work or my position with the company in consideration, only asking for sufficient leave to clean up the work I then had in hand, and at the same time giving my brother a chance to pick up after the appendicitis operation. Since that time my brother has returned from the HOSPITAL, only to find that he has had to keep his bed every day since, having been affected with the old tubercular trouble where he was operated on for appendicitis. For any further information regarding him I would refer you to DR. STENTAFORD of this town.

I have also been held responsible for managing the business of SAUNDERS, HOWELL & CO. LTD here at CARBONEAR for the past several years. This firm I wish to add is doing what is considered a good deal of war work, we having extensive contracts for fish boxes, some twenty thousand of which is being shipped direct to FRANCE while another thirty to fifty thousand is being shipped to the STATES and GREAT BRITAIN. We being the only firm who is properly in a position to handle this box business, as we have during the past year gone to considerable expense in order to be in a position to handle the business. It has been my duties to figure and contract for this business and am held responsible for the carrying out of the contracts.
