We wrote to you on the 5th May, 1919 stating that Pte. Pilgrim was suffering from advanced tuberculosis, and on 9th May you replied that we might arrange to keep him in this hospital until his condition had improved sufficiently to warrant his removal to Newfoundland.

He has improved considerably and is able to do a little light work in the wards. His mental condition is still unstable and he is subject to fits of depression at times. The M.O. i/c in charge of his case does not think he will be fit to undertake so long a journey for at least two months, and then only if the present improvement is maintained.



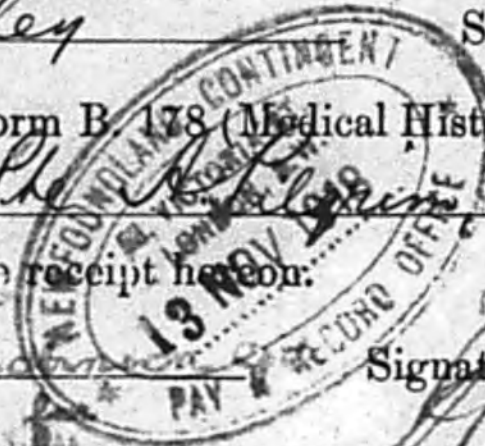
