STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

1731, Pte. Manuel Pittman - Little Bay East, Fortune Bay.

Enlisted - July 1915. Proceeded Overseas - October 1915

Company in France - "D" Company

Place & Date of Capture - Momchy-le-Preux. April 14th, 1917

Circumstances of Capture - When we found ourselves completely surrounded by the Germans we were taken prisoners. I was slightly wounded in the leg by a ~~bullet~~ bayonet.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - After a few days at Douai and Fort McDonald, Lille I was sent to Guesnain for about two months. I have the same to say about the above mentioned places as the others have said. I was then sent to Marchiennes for about 4 months working in the woods and lumber camps there. The treatment here was the same as we got everywhere else while we were kept in France - very poor food and scarce, no blankets and long hours of hard work. Pte. Charlie Snow of Hr. Grade died at the camp while I was there, from weakness brought on by starvation. Then I was shifted to Germany and went to Friedericksville for almost two weeks. My next move was to Birkemaur where I was for about 13 months working on the Railway. When the food parcels from the Red Cross arrived our conditions improved, for we were almost down and out from starvation before they came. Then I was sent out to work on a farm at Segeberg for about two months until the armistice was signed.

I was repatriated via Copenhagen and arrived at Hull on January 3rd, 1919.

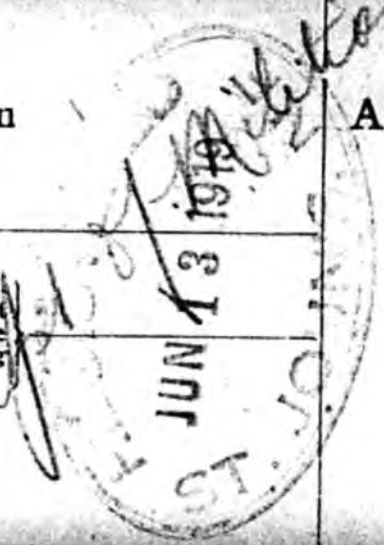

No doubt you will have seen in the papers that a personal parcel is now allowed to be sent each quarter to prisoners of war by their relatives.

You know, of course, that all food and woollen comforts allowed to prisoners are sent regularly to your son through the official channels by the Newfoundland War Contingent Association. It is felt, however, that you would like to have the opportunity of sending ~~some~~ parcels direct to him, packed by yourself, which goes straight through the post.

Enclosed with this letter you will find a blue coupon, which must be affixed to the parcel, (in addition to the postage, as advertised), and a copy of the War Office circular, giving full particulars with regard to this. The instructions must be carried out to the letter, not more than a half pound of sweets may be enclosed, and we wish to draw your attention particularly to the last paragraph of the circular, which shows you that if you put any article not mentioned on the list given in the circular, the whole parcel may be confiscated. You can select any articles from the list up to a maximum weight of 11 pounds.

We are giving your son's latest address, to which this parcel must be directed. Please pack the parcel strongly, and write the address as given below, very clearly. When sending the parcel you may show this circular to the P. M.
