With reference to your request of 6th Feb. to have a parcel addressed to your brother No. 3703, Pte. G. Pomeroy, returned to you, I have the honour to state that a letter has just been received from the Record Office, London stating that, as Private Pomeroy is now a prisoner of war, it is regretted that this parcel was forwarded to the B.E.F. on Feb. 4th for distribution in accordance with practice. The practice is that parcels for soldiers who have become deceased or prisoners of war are opened, and if they contain perishable articles are distributed in hospitals, or at the front. You are aware, of course, that a parcel packed by a private individual cannot be forwarded to a prisoner of war

I am a prisoner of war in Germany and am wounded in the right arm. I am in a good hospital and am getting good treatment. I spent a fairly good Xmas of course if I had been up out of bed no doubt it would have been better. However we must not complain. Have you heard from home lately. It is about two months since I last heard from it I am longing for some news from it now. I wrote home a fortnight ago but I don't know if they will get it as it is addressed with indelible pencil. It is alright if it doesn't rub out it having such a distance to go. Now Sir you will certainly say this is not my writing but I have to write with my left hand and as I never wrote with my left hand before you will have to excuse me. I suppose it is better to write with my left hand than not at all. Now Sir as soon as you get this please write home and tell Father where I am and give him my address, It is on the top of the paper. I would be very thankful with a parcel if you could send me one through the Red Cross Society. If you do please send me a piece of soap and some cigarettes and whatever else you think suitable. If you can put my name in any fund for parcels you can kindly do so and I will be very thankful. Please remember me to all the family. Now Sir I think I have said about all for present. So wishing you every success. I am yours sincerely

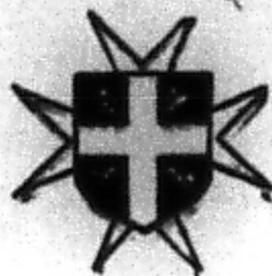

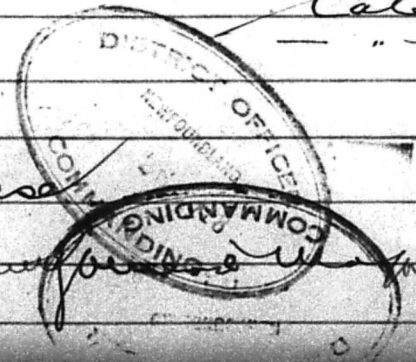


