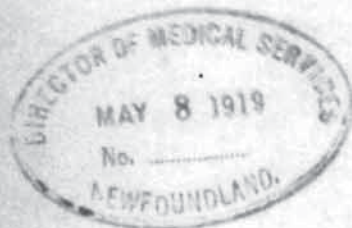

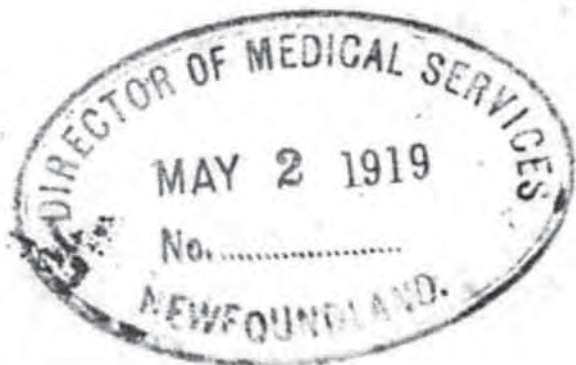

Reference attached letter from Lieut. Power. There is considerable dis-satisfaction in this Battalion over the apparently haphazard system under which promotions are made in the Regiment.

The complaints made to me by Officers of the Battalion come under two headings,-

- (a) Officers given substantive promotion to higher ranks over the heads of other Officers who have not been reported on as unfit for promotion.
- (b) Officers being given "Temporary" higher rank, which for all practical purposes is much the same as substantive, instead of "Acting."

Full justice can be done to any Officers of outstanding merit by granting them "Acting" higher rank.

With regard to the individual case of Lieut. Power - this Officer has served under my command for only a short time, but so far as I can judge he would seem fit for promotion, in his turn, to the rank of Captain, ^{and} unless he has been previously reported on as unfit for promotion, I consider that a grave injustice has been done him.

I would suggest that all promotions to substantive rank be granted in order of seniority, provided that the Officers in question are favourably reported on, and that temporary rank be granted very sparingly. There would appear to be no reason why it should now be granted to any Officers ~~of this~~ of the Regiment serving in this Country or in France.

Lt.Col. Berners R.N.R. 106/18 and my R.N.R. 228/18 refer to other complaints of officers over the question of their promotions.

Reference attached letter from Lieut. Power. There is considerable dis-satisfaction in this Battalion over the apparently haphazard system under which promotions are made in the Regiment.

The complaints made to me by Officers of the Battalion come under two headings,-

- (a) Officers given substantive promotion to higher ranks over the heads of other Officers who have not been reported on as unfit for promotion.
- (b) Officers being given "Temporary" higher rank, which for all practical purposes is much the same as substantive, instead of "Acting."

Full justice can be done to any Officers of outstanding merit by granting them "Acting" higher rank.

With regard to the individual case of Lieut. Power - this Officer has served under my command for only a short time, but so far as I can judge he would seem fit for promotion, in his turn, to the rank of Captain, ^{and} unless he has been previously reported on as unfit for promotion, I consider that a grave injustice has been done him.

I would suggest that all promotions to substantive rank be granted in order of seniority, provided that the Officers in question are favourably reported on, and that Temporary Rank be granted very sparingly. There would appear to be no reason why it should now be granted to any Officers ~~of this~~ of the Regiment serving in this Country or in France.

Lt.Col. Berner's R.N.R. 106/18 and my R.N.R. 228/18 refer to other complaints of officers over the question of their promotions.



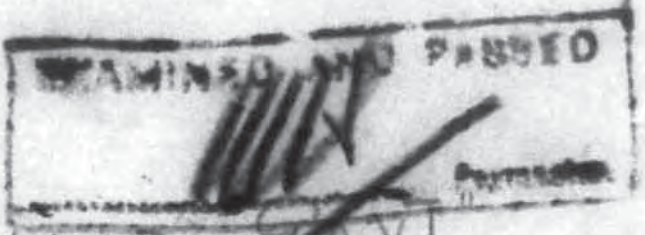
