Proceedings of Board of Inquiry, into Case of Patrick Power, First Newfoundland Regiment, re accident resulting in fractured leg, about Feb. 26th. 1915.

The Board consisted of:-

- Lieut. J. Nunns.

and was convened by order of the Officer Commanding Lt. Col. Sir W. E. Davidson, K.C.M.G., under his letter to the Adjutant dated May 12th. 1915. Statements of Private Power and Lt. Burden Medical-Officer were taken as attached.

Medical Officer's certificate is also attached.

The finding of the Board is as follows:-

(-1-) The condition of this soldier, Private Patrick Power was the result of an accident to which he was contributory.

It was not the result of malice, drunkenness or misbehavior. *No charge was made against Res.*

(-2-) It is the opinion of the Medical Officer, that though at present unfit for Active Service as the result of injury, he would probably be fit in about two months. His position at present is that of a convalescent.

(-3-) This Board recommends that Private Power be carried on the strength of the Regiment under Pay and Service Regulations governing such cases until the eve of the departure of F. Company, when he be made the subject of a Medical Board for final disposal.

Statement Private Patrick Power before Board of Inquiry held at C.L.B. Armoury May 14th. '15.

occurred in guard room C.L.B. Armoury about February 26th. Was a member of ~~army~~^{guard}. Has just been relieved and returned to guard room. A member of the Regiment name unknown suggested skylarking. I stood up and caught hold of him. My leg turned and broke. We were just fooling. We were the only two that were fooling. Father Nangle and others assisted me. A doctor came in also. I was removed to hospital in an ambulance. Dr's. Knight & Anderson attended me. I was satisfied with attendance at hospital. Am staying at 2 Patrick St. Left hospital about April 19th. '15. Reported to Capt. Ayre and got leave to go home. Went home to Tor's Cove. Reported again about May 1st. '15. Aged 30. Enlisted about February 3rd. 1915.

Capt. Ayre said pay would go on until leg got strong enough to work. Am willing to go on again as soon as fit. Was previously a blacksmith's help at Reid's for 3 years. Earned about \$1.00 per day just before enlisting working on reduced time.

Patrick Power, private, while skylarking with his chums in the guardroom about 27th or 28th February broke his leg. He has been lately released from Hospital and the doctors certify that he is unfit for active service and recommends discharge. In order to obviate the possibility of future claims being made I would suggest that you appoint a Regimental Board of Enquiry to sit on the case, ascertain the facts and do what is necessary. I have told Power to report at the C.L.B. Armoury 11 a.m. Friday and would if possible like the Board to sit at that time. I would suggest the Board consist of Capt. Goodridge, myself and Lieut. Nunns.
