I also beg to make known to you that I took charge of No 3 platoon while on Gallipoli and also in France and was acting Sergeant when I took my platoon into action on July 18/1916 my officer informed me that I would get my full rank as Sergeant after the charge was over, but unfortunately my officer (Mr Ross) was killed and I was left on no mans land near three days, badly wounded, as I heard no more of my sergeant stripes this is my first application and I trust Sir you will give this letter your personal consideration
