3444 Richards.

2951 Ridgeley.

Both at King George Hospital, Ward B.5.

Richards was taken prisoner on the 20th November, 1917. He was in Senne, and as he was not reported at the Office, no food or clothing were sent to him. He was well treated, had an anaesthetic when his leg was amputated (half way below the knee) and women nurses. He looks in excellent health and seems to have had good medical attention. The food supplied is not good, but British prisoners with parcels always help those who have none.

Ridgeley was at Hameln, where there are other Newfoundland prisoners of War. He had no complaints, was well treated in hospital, and said one of the nurses was very nice. He received his food parcels regularly, and says that these food parcels are quite sufficient without any at all of the German food. The parcels are given out by the censoring department, opened in front of the prisoners, and the contents given to them, with the exception of the tins. These are numbered and kept back, a ticket being handed to the prisoner, who may apply for the tins and get them on presentation of the ticket. There is ample space for outside exercise, and there is a library in the camp. The other Newfoundlanders at Hameln are very well, and getting their food parcels. They are allowed to be together, and they manage to get notes to each other when they are moved on. (This is a matter of "Management" and probably against the regulations). Ridgeley's report was most reassuring, and certainly Hameln seems to be a good camp.

Neither Prisoner of War had any story of ill treatment, experienced or witnessed.

Richards was taken prisoner on the 20th November 1917. He was in Senne, and as he was not reported at the Office, no food or clothing were sent to him. He was well treated, had an anaesthetic when his leg was amputated (half way below the knee) and women nurses. He looks in excellent health and seems to have had good medical attention. The food supplied is not good, but British prisoners with parcels always help those who have none.

Ridgeley was at Hameln, where there are other Newfoundland prisoners of war. He had no complaints, was well treated in hospital, and said one of the nurses was very nice. He received his food parcels regularly, and says that these food parcels are quite sufficient without any at all of the German food. The parcels are given out by the censoring department, opened in front of the prisoners, and the contents given to them, with the exception of the tins. These are numbered and kept back, a ticket being handed to the prisoner, who may apply for the tins and get them on presentation of the ticket. There is ample space for outside exercise, and there is a library in the camp. The other Newfoundlanders at Hameln are very well, and getting their food parcels. They are allowed to be together, and they manage to get notes to each other when they are moved on. (This is a matter of "management" and probably against regulations). Ridgeley's report was most reassuring, and certainly Hameln seems to be a good camp.

Neither prisoner of war had any story of ill treatment, experienced or witnessed.
