Richards was taken prisoner on the 20th November, 1917. He was in Senne, and as he was not reported at the Office, no food or clothing were sent to him. He was well treated, had an anaesthetic when his leg was amputated (half way below the knee) and women nurses. He looks in excellent health and seems to have had good medical attention. The food supplied is not good, but British prisoners with parcels always help those who have none.

Ridgeley was at Hameln, where there are other Newfoundland prisoners of War. He had no complaints, was well treated in hospital, and said one of the nurses was very nice. He received his food parcels regularly, and says that these food parcels are quite sufficient without any at all of the German food. The parcels are given out by the censoring department, opened in front of the prisoners, and the contents given to them, with the exception of the tins. These are numbered and kept back, a ticket being handed to the prisoner, who may apply for the tins and get them on presentation of the ticket. There is ample space for outside exercise, and there is a library in the camp. The other Newfoundlanders at Hameln are very well, and getting their food parcels. They are allowed to be together, and they manage to get notes to each other when they are moved on. (This is a matter of "Management" and probably against the regulations). Ridgeley's report was most reassuring, and certainly Hameln seems to be a good camp.

Neither Prisoner of War had any story of ill treatment, experienced or witnessed.

It may be mentioned that it is the practice for Soldiers to leave their kits here for storage, to be called for etc., when the system is to assign a reference number and register in a book kept for that purpose. On production of the ticket with relative number, the package or packages are handed out.

Sometimes soldiers merely leave their bags in the corridor without notification to anyone, in which cases the packages are placed in the store. Periodically a clearing up takes place and unclaimed or unidentifiable public clothing is sent to the Depot, personal property being





In reply to your letter of the 18th instant, I beg to say that the sending of private parcels to Prisoners of War in Germany is not permitted, except in the case of Officers. Provision is made, however, by the Authorities in England for the sending of ^{the} three parcels fortnightly to each Prisoner of War, containing both food and clothing, and all the requirements of our boys will be fully met by the efforts of these organizations.

Letters, however, can be sent by friends, but they must be addressed care of the Newfoundland Pay and Record Office, 58 Victoria Street, London, S.W. Sums of money not in excess of 2/- per week can also be sent through the same channel.

You may rest assured that everything possible will be done for the comfort and welfare of those of our boys who may be Prisoners, and that, by the efforts of our good friends in England, any inconvenience that may be suffered by them during their sojourn in Germany, will be reduced to the minimum.
