Dear Sir:-

I happened to go into the office of Mr. C. E. Russell J. P. of this town yesterday afternoon, and I found there two men (belonging to Spaniards Bay) collecting money for one Stephen Roberts a returned soldier who they said was in the sanatorium in St. Johns and not getting any pension or help of any kind. They had a letter from Mr. B. B. Squires J. P. of Spaniards Bay to that effect.

Mr. Russell started to tell me about it before a number of men and I said I did not believe it as I had been in hospital for a number of times and while there had always received a total disability pension. I then started to question the men and they seemed to get flustered. I found out later that they had been collecting money for that purpose right through the town. People were talking about it and I thought they were doing an injustice to the board of pension Commissioners. Therefore, I am requesting you of the matter so that if their statement is not correct they should be stopped.
