Dear Sir,

Our boy, Private Claude Lerrick, No 4434, is due to report to the Military on Monday next the 16th inst. - but it will be quite impossible for him to go on to St. John. He was apparently well until yesterday. Not having had an attack of the trouble from which he is suffering for three weeks, and being in the meantime able to eat & sleep; ~~being~~ both physically and mentally in his normal condition. Last night, however, shortly after going to bed he had another bad attack. It commenced with severe pains in the head and spine; for some time he was quite rational, then he became delirious, and violent, and remained in that condition for about three hours. When he felt asleep and slept quite soundly all night. This morning he is quite rational and the pain is not nearly as severe. He will not be in a fit

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a fit condition to travel on Monday. I have planned to accompany him to St Johns. fearing that the excitement of the journey might cause a relapse; and shall be glad as soon as convenient to know the decision of the Military authorities in regard to him. Dr. Gill is now of opinion that his affliction is not intermittent meningitis, the intervals between the attacks being longer than is usually the case in that disease. If you can give us any advice from a medical standpoint we shall greatly appreciate it. for we will quite understand that his condition is causing us much painful anxiety.

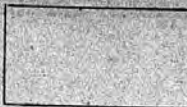
