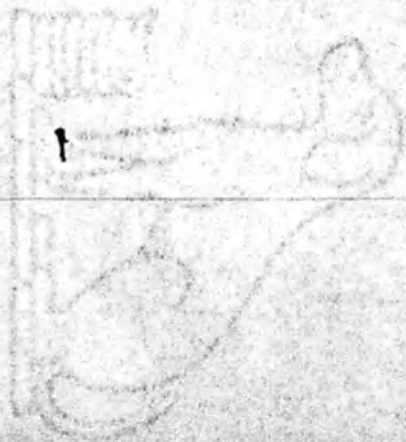



No. 712 Ex-Sergt. Joseph Shacen

The above noted soldier is the bearer of this note. In 1914 he and his brother, David, were in this country and left eleven members of their family at their home at Lechfid about thirty miles from Beyrout in Mt. Lebanon. There are now only two members of this family left, the rest having been wiped out through enemy action during the war. The two left are Sergt. Shacen's brother, Elias, and David's wife, Lilla. They are both anxious now to have these two people brought to this country, and are seeking some advice concerning the possibility of that. It is understood that each one of these two would require to have in their possession \$200.00, and the Shacen brothers state that each one of them would have \$200.00 on their arrival here. Neither of these is able to speak English nor to write, and Shacen is anxious to secure some certificate which they could mail to them, and which they could produce when required by the railroad or steamship authorities or other people qualified to enquire into their destination. Such certificate would assist them owing to their lack of English and would also show that they are bound for a definite destination, namely Newfoundland where they are going to join relatives.

I suggest that if you are able to assist the Shacen brothers, that in addition to this certificate which they seek, and which to my mind would have most weight if signed by you, that you should address a letter to the British Consul General, Beyrout, Syria, asking him to assist them in getting on their way. If you are able to assist the Shacens in this way, they could write at once to their people and instruct them to go to Beyrout and apply to the British Consul General.

I am forwarding you a copy of a letter received from Ex-Pte. J. Shaeen, of The Royal Newfoundland Regiment, together with a letter received by him from his home. Pte. Shaeen states, as you will notice, that certain monies sent to his people by him have apparently not been paid as directed, and have not been refunded. I am taking the liberty of addressing you in connection with his affair, and would be very grateful for the courtesy of your attention and any assistance that you can render.

Sir:

I want to ask your advice with regard to, what to me, is a very serious matter and which concerns those who are left of our family in Syria. As you are probably aware, the conditions in Syria are as bad, if not worse, than during the war, largely owing to the shortage of money, and it is with the express purpose of remedying this - as far as my own family is concerned, at least - that I am asking your kind advice.

In May 1915 myself and my brother sent £20. to our people thro' the Bank of Nova Scotia, via Mr. Mansour-il-Hilaw, New York to a person by the name of Assad Mauf Jage, who was to in turn give the money to its rightful owners. (This crude method of sending money was the only possible way at that time.)

11

Unfortunately, just about that time all communication with Syria was stopped owing to Turkey entering the war. From then we had no news until the war came to an end. The first letters we received made no mention of any money. We then wrote and asked them of it and stated particulars. On writing to us again they said that this man Gage, acknowledged receiving the money and kept it himself. This act was very cruel indeed, because we are convinced that had he given our family the money they would not, as it transpired later, become practically wiped out from starvation. At least it would have lided them over the worst period. Even now he refuses to hand over the money.

Again, on Sept. 5, 1919 we sent £62. stg. to my brother Elias, who, ignorantly, we admit, gave the draft to an unscrupulous individual to change for him at the Ottoman Bank, Beirut, with the result that he gave my brother French money equivalent to about £30.

We are ~~in~~ rather a bad way about our family and naturally enough, we want to assist them as ~~good~~^{much} as we can until the country becomes settled again. Of course, money is the only thing we can send them, and if each time we send money they either do not receive it at all or, at the best, only partially, it is rather a very poor situation. Furthermore, to keep on sending money and to be robbed each time is simply throwing it away.

I am asking your ^{help} advice because I know that your sympathy will be given to a soldier, ^{who like yourself,} has done "his bit," also because you are in a position, as head of the military here, to either approach some high authority or recommend me to do so.

Letters etc. if needed I will be able to show as evidence.
