

Mr. Smith writes that he received notification on May 14th that his son was missing on April 14th. On June 15th he received another message stating that his son was a prisoner of war at Limburg. He received a letter from his son dated July 17th and another dated July 30th which was received by him on 30th Dec. This is in accordance with records in our office. I am afraid he must have been misinformed concerning Smith being killed in action.




