Dear Madam:-

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of October 21st, dealing with the matter of the estate and pension of No. 2868, Private W.H. Smith.

The point raised in your letter is of a purely technical legal character, and was, therefore, referred to the Minister of Justice for advice. A reply has now been received from him, in which he states that "in the absence of a will, the estate of a deceased soldier must be paid to the next of kin, and as the father of Private W.H. Smith appears to be living, he, as the next of kin, is entitled to his son's estate."

I might say that the Minister of Justice has a right to appoint the administrator to an estate, the value of which does not exceed \$500.00. If he were to exercise that right in this particular case, in favour of you, Private Smith's father, as the next of kin and entitled to the estate, might legally compel you to pay the amount over to him.

I regret, therefore, that under these circumstances, the estate of this soldier must be paid to his next of kin. It might be possible for you to arrange with his father for settlement in your favour; and a letter from the father to that effect would have to be produced.

Respecting the matter of pension, your claim should be made to the Board of Pension Commissioners, who have full power to deal with all matters concerning pensions of deceased and discharged soldiers.



I am directed by the Minister of Justice to acknowledge receipt of yours of the 29th ultimo, covering letter from Mrs. A. J. Crocker, of Swift Current, P.B., concerning the estate of the late Pte. Wm. H. Smith.


In reply I beg to say that in the absence of a will the estate of a deceased soldier must be paid to the next of kin, and as the father of Wm. H. Smith appears to be living, he as next of kin is entitled to his son's estate.

The Minister of Justice has the right to appoint the Administrator in estates the value of which does not exceed five hundred dollars, and if he were to exercise that right in this case in favour of the grandmother, Mrs. Crocker, the father of the soldier, being the next of kin, would be entitled to the estate and might legally compel her to pay the amount in her hands over to him.

Respecting the matter of a pension, if she is entitled to any such, her claim should be made to the Pensions Board.

Dear Sir:-

I am writing to you about
my grandson Pte William Henry
Smith reported missing and now
I believe reported officially, as killed
on April 14th 1917.

I have been receiving his
allotment money up to middle
of September. I do not know
how long this will continue
to come to me. But there
have come to his father Robert
Smith, papers concerning pension
and the administration of his
Estate.

Now should there be any
pension or back money etc I
think that I have the first
claim to such, because I took
him Smith when he was two and
a half years old as my own
child and reared him up.

I am a widow and seventy seven years old and have seen some hard days. After striving hard for some years to rear up a lad it seems unfair for those who have done nothing to receive the benefits.

I shall be glad if you will write me the particulars of this matter. If there is any Estate (I know of nothing except the foundation of a house worth \$2500 given him by myself) the worth of it, that is the back money; if I can claim any pension; and to whom I can write for advice or state my claims. The very fact that he left me his allotment money shows that he wished his money to come to me as he was my support.

I will be glad if you will let me know if I have any claims and if they are legal.

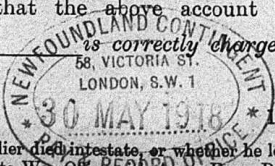


