I am writing you this short letter to see if you can get me a furlough home as I know I am entitled to one & will state the case to you in my own way well I was married just before war broke out but I enlist in the first five hundred and came across with them and went to the Dardanelles & was there till December 4 then I got frost bitten feet and had to leave the Regiment well I got to England and after coming out of Hospital I went to France in March and got wounded in the big drive of July I well I was in Hospital for five months and my wife was coming over to see me she went to the Governor to see about her passage and he told her that if she wait till I came out of Hospital he give me a furlough home to see her

well as you know as soon as I heard
 about it I tried to get out of Hospital
 as quick as I could well I was wounded
 pretty bad that time but I never got home
 although I was eight months at the depot
 fit for nothing else but to go home eight
 months was long enough to go home twice
 and beside that I was unfit at the time
