Then the Germans made their big counter-attack and we were soon surrounded. I was hit by a piece of shrapnel in the leg. About 20 of us altogether were taken prisoners at the time.

Details of Life and Treatment - They marched us back through their lines to a collecting station, and the same evening marched us to Douai where we stayed for three days, during which time we were questioned very closely for information. We were then sent to Fort Mac-Donald in Lille for about a week. Here we <sup>were</sup> packed into a dark cell with concrete floors and no covering of any kind. It was damp and cold and had no ventilation and the latrines consisted of a tub in the corner. We had no water to wash with just enough food to keep us from starving. Then we were sent up nearer the lines on working parties to Desmain, where we helped to build a canal. We were here a month. We had a pretty bad time on the whole. We were billeted in a house, which had nothing but a roof and the posts on the sides. The sides were not covered in and we had to sleep there just as we stood. We had to work from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily, and only one break during the day - at 12 p.m. The sentries were always on the watch to keep us working and if anyone showed signs of slacking he was hit with the butt of a rifle. Then I got sick and was sent to Dulmen for about 6 weeks, and was put on Camp fatigues. The food here was worse and we were almost starved. Then from Dulmen I was sent to East Prussia and from here to Insterburg, where conditions were worse than ever in the matter of food- nothing
