On attacking he was hit by Shrapnel in the side of chest & right arm. He was sent straight over to this hospital via Rouen. On admission had some paralysis of extensors muscles right arm. Some dulness, impaired breathing & pleural friction was present in chest. He had an operation by which bullet was extracted, from the lung a portion of rib being resected for the purpose. Went to Esher & then Alkington Convalescent Home. The paralysis of his arm continued, being treated by massage & electricity.

He has to wear a relaxation splint & has daily massage & faradism which may make improvement in time.

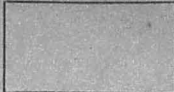
