NEWFOUNDLAND CONTINGENT.OFFICERS' PAY.

Misapprehension on the part of some Officers regarding method of drawing Pay etc. appears to have arisen.

Prior to the hurried departure of the 1st Battalion, memorandum of procedure agreed was handed to the adjutant to be explained to the Officers, and I am informed in writing was explained.

The memorandum provided that Officers would draw their requirements through the Adjutant, using A.Bs. 64, as in the W. Os. N.C.Os. and Men, and that Deposits to Officers Banking Accounts as hitherto, would cease forthwith.

A letter confirming the arrangement was mailed to Khartoum, the then duly authorised Postal address. Sometime later on this letter was returned through the Post Office, re-directed, and acknowledged by telegram.

Meanwhile in numerous and continuance instances Officers had drawn both on Acquittance Rolls and on their Bankers, and frequently in the latter case, without funds to meet their cheques, with the result that in order to save the credit of the Regiment and of those Officers who had credit balances, it has been necessary to make desultory deposits.

After exchange of several telegrams with the O. C. 1st Battalion, arrangements have now been made that:-

- (a) Pay & Allowance due to Officers will be paid to their Bankers, at the close of each Pay Period (every fourth Friday);
- (b) Amounts drawn from Imperial Army Pay Officers will be refunded to and as claimed by Command Paymaster, London, as customary; but recovered from Officers' Banking accounts.
- (c) No advances against Pay & Allowances can be made unless under Regulations, or authority signed by the O. C. a Battalion.

A statement of your account made up to last Pay Period ended 17/3/16, upon information then available, is enclosed for your information. Since that date various claims have been made by the Command Paymaster, London, and are being dealt with in accordance with paragraph (b).
