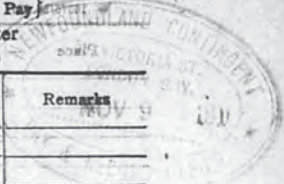



The Canadian Rates of Travelling Allowance are shown in Financial Instructions etc., etc. G.E.F. 1916, para. 836. This has only recently been issued, and a copy has been mailed to you under separate cover. This, together with copies of the Canadian Pay & Allowance Regs., 1916, and Instructions governing Organisation & Administration, 1916, mailed to H.E. the Governor 8/8/16 should be of useful reference.

This is to certify that I have known the above named officer since the autumn of 1919 when he came immediately after his discharge and registered as a student in this College.

On his arrival here Mr. Stenlake exhibited, very soon after the work of the session commenced, signs of nervous exhaustion. This was complicated by attacks of malaria. Mr. Stenlake was examined by the College medical examiner Dr. W.F. Hamilton who described him as in a very serious condition. As a result he was allowed to do only about one - fifth on the year's work.

Last summer he spent on a Mission Field in the Canadian West from whence he returned in a apparently good condition. Of late however, he has suffered further attacks of malaria and is now almost as bad a condition as he was last year. It seems inevitable that he should have special care. As he is without resources to enable him to do so and as his physical disability is fully 50%, I would earnestly request, in view of the above circumstances and of his long and distinguished record of service that very serious consideration be given to this case, with a view to granting him a pension until he shall have been able to recover his health.

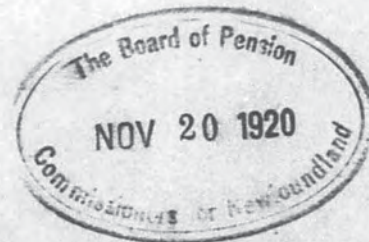

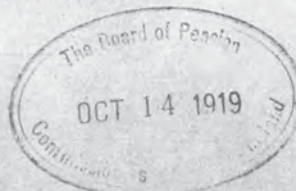

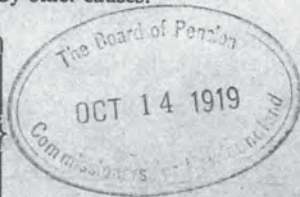

The matter of your communication of April 20th, respecting Lieut. J.B.O'Reilly and W.D. Stenlake, was allowed to stand over until the return of the Chairman Hon. E.R. Bowering, and at a meeting last night this material was submitted for consideration. He remarked with reference to the allowances of \$25 made for certain cases for the transport of officers from Ayr to London taking office in the Chaplains' Department or Medical Department that you had travelling warrants available for these officers which would ensure them of transport without having to pay for it, and he thought it was desirable that we should know whether any intimation had been given to these officers, that such facilities were available and might be utilized by them. It was also agreed that I should invite a suggestion from you as to a regular scale in such cases, in view of the fact that we do not know the travelling charges or the usual period for which these officers have to remain in London before acceptance by the Department in which they desired employment.

The desire of the Committee is to be as fair as them as possible so as not to impose any undue strain on their finances but at the same time it is not our intention that any person sent overseas to undertake duty with branches of the service apart from the Newfoundland Regiment, should be supplied with funds by the Colony for an indefinite period.
