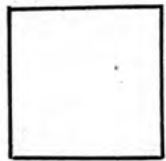



Dear Corpl:-

I am in receipt of your letter 24th Dec. concerning the matter of promotion, and I have gone into the question as well as I possibly could.

I referred the matter to the Director of Medical Services in a personal way to find out if it was necessary for a man of a higher rank than Corpl. to take charge of the Medical Room of the Foresters. The Director of Medical Services states that, in his opinion, the rank of Corpl. is in keeping with the work which has to be performed and responsibility.

I also referred the matter to Major Sullivan who happens to be out here at present. His statement is, that when he obtained your services from the 2nd Battalion, you were a private, and your promotion to Corpl. during the time you have been with the Foresters has been as rapid to date as might be expected. He appreciates the fact that your work is important, and considers that you are giving satisfaction, but cannot under present condition feel justified in promoting you to a higher rank.

I have tried to put your case as strongly as possibly, though it was only possible to do so in a personal way, as you will understand, the administration of the Forestry

Cos. in Scotland is a matter outside the jurisdiction of this Dept. In any matters of interior discipline, and administration, Major Sullivan is a competent authority.

However, I hope you will not be discouraged by my favour to push your request more effectively; but stick to it, and I feel sure that eventually your services and good work will get you the promotion that you so earnestly desire.

I am glad to hear that you are in good health; and I have no doubt that life in the highlands of Scotland is rather more pleasant than the trenches of Gallipoli.





Dear Sir,

In the following few lines I am asking you to do me a favour because I know of no one connected with the N.F.L.D. Regmt ^{who} has the influence and power to put forward my request better than you.

I look to you as the one friend I have because of you having once before judged my character and thought fit to recommend me to Lt Col. De Burton for acceptance in the Regmt in the early stages of the war namely the 25th Feb; 1915. at Edinburgh Castle

At that time the O.C. relied on you for my future good behaviour and I'm exceedingly pleased to be in the position to tell you that your trust was wellfounded because since the first day I enlisted I have kept a clean "Conduct-Sheet" which is a good record for almost three years service nearly all of that period being in the ranks

During that time I have served in Surra Bay. where I was sorry to see you get it that first morning. Egypt. France and Belgium, being finally knocked out at the heels of Capt. J. Donnelly. C. Company. on the 12th Oct 1916.

From the time I came out of Hospital last January I have been classified iii three and was given a post in the Medical Room at the Racecourse. Ayr. under Capt Johnston

Here my previous knowledge of medical work stood me in good stead as my recommendations from Lt Col. Webster R.A.M.C. Scottish Command. Edinburgh. and Capt Johnston. R.A.M.C. who was at that time in charge of the Regmt at Ayr. can prove. When the Forestry Coy's started work in this country they had no medical orderly and asked one from the Regmt and as I was unfit for Active service I was sent to fill the vacancy. My work here is very essential and I have a small Hospital of six beds which accommodate serious accidents until sent to Perth for proper treatment.

Besides numerous small wounds we also have a heavy "Sick-Parade" owing I guess to some of the men not being quite strong enough for the heavy ^{work} they attempt to do.

We have no M.O. attached to us as our numbers are not yet sufficient to entitle us to have one and we have to depend on a civilian Doctor who comes between the times of visiting his many patients scattered throughout the district.

Although I believe my work is appreciated I have no one behind me to give me a lift in the scale of promotion and I'm sure that a little influence from one who has attained such a high and proud position in the "Army" as you now hold would bear fruit in getting me my great desire which is to hold the rank of Colour Sergeant or Staff Sergeant. If I could retire from the service when the war is over holding that rank. I would always look back upon my many hardships and wounds with honour and no matter what part

of the new world I settle in it will be with happy memories of my connection with the Newfoundland Contingent.

I may also mention that I hold certificates for "Massage" and "Chiroprody" work which I find very useful here in my ordinary medical room work. but as the numbers of the Coy's only reach 400 men all ranks I am not allowed to draw proficiency pay which I would get if I was still on the strength of the fighting force at the Depot.

The work of our Foresters here is earning admiration from all-comers, some of whom have had connection with lumber work in pre-war days and taking into consideration that only unfit men are employed it is wonderful the amount of timber that has been taken from the Scottish hills and after being sawed to the required sizes at the mills sent on to where the Timber Supply want them most.

I will now close hoping that you dont look upon me as forward in asking you to act on my behalf. as I have always looked upon and regarded you as my one and only friend in the commissioned ranks.
