I find that you were attested into the Regiment on 1st May, 1918, (Regimental Number 4821) and discharged on 3-5-18, so that your service amounted to 3 days inclusive. As your service was for so short a period and took place before the Military Service Act became operative you will be classed as a rejected man and will be called for re-examination on October 31st, 1918.
