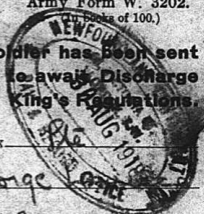
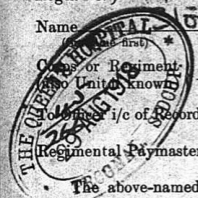

NOTE.—(i.) From this amount must be deducted \$100.00 paid to you under Post Discharge Pay Regulations, \$60.00 paid to your wife as Separation Allowance under those Regulations, and also two payments of \$70.00 to you, and two payments of \$30.00 each to your wife under War Service Gratuity Regulations, making a total of \$360.00 to be deducted from your \$600.00. This leaves your credit balance at this date \$239.90.

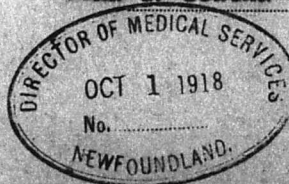

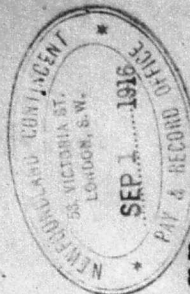
