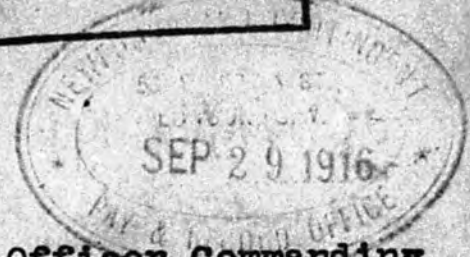

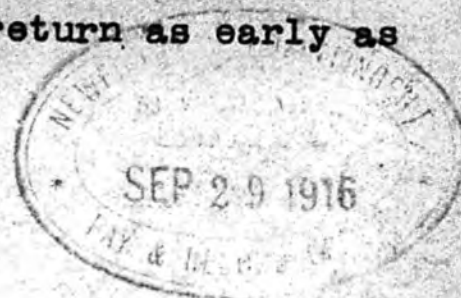

P#138 Pte W. Thomson states:-

On 8th inst between 3 and 4 p.m
I was in Coy. 2nd Regt's dugout with
#139 Pte J Thomson and C2 M.S. Harley.
As far as I know, the ^{former} found on the
floor of dugout what appeared to be an
ordinary 303 empty shell case and had
it in his hand.

In some way which I could not see
this case exploded and Pte Thomson
asked me if I was hurt. His hand
was bleeding considerably and the
C2 M.S. ^{then} went with him to the Dressing
Station. The C2 M.S. was also wound-
ed by explosion, slightly.

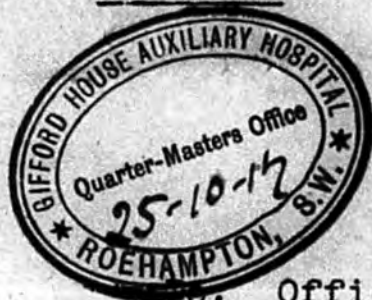



STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

Date & Place of Capture - Monchy-le-Freux, April 14th, 1917

Circumstances of Capture - We were scattered about in shell holes after the attack, and in the big German counterattack we found ourselves completely surrounded, and were taken prisoners.

Details of life and treatment under capture - We were marched to Douai, and remained there for four days and then on to Fort MacDonal in Lille. I can say the same about this place as all the others have said. Five days afterwards we were sent up to Marquion just behind the German lines for seven weeks. We were under our own shell fire all the time. We were put to work unloading trains and repairing roads etc. We had a hard time of it there - very little food, no money, no blankets or greatcoats, and no comforts of any kind. We then were (Then we were shifted to Wallers for about a month) sent to Denain for about a month. The treatment here was a little better - and we had a blanket given us. Here we were working at farm work. Our next move was to Bouchesnes, where we stayed until December 1917. We had to work at Railway dumps and slaughter houses. We were kept dirty all the time as we were not given any soap and only very little water and had no changes of underclothes at all. We ~~were~~ slept in our clothes and we were filthily lousy all the time, without being able to help it. Food was very scarce all the time. Then we were sent to Schneidermahl in Germany to a distributing camp from which we used to be sent off on working parties to various places roundabout. We were up in Bromberg, in Poland, when the armistice was signed. The treatment here was about the same as in other Camps - lack of food, dull monotony and hard work. We were repatriated to England via Danzig and Leith, and arrived at Ripon on Xmas Day.


