Dental Treatment for P. & R.O. Staff.

Your letter of June 28th, 1917 to the Secretary of the Nfld. Patriotic Finance Committee, No 6345/16, has been referred to this Department for consideration and action.

I have made enquiries as to the procedure adopted in this matter, and have received the following information.

- (1) The London District Order No. 96 of April 10th, 1916 Paragraph 18, makes perfectly plain the procedure to be followed in order to have Dental Treatment performed at the public expense.
- (2) These facilities were placed explicitly at the disposal of the staff of the P. & R.O. by War Office letter 121/Overseas/2845, (F.1) of 17/10/16. (The contents of this letter will, presumably, have been conveyed to such men as may have joined the P. & R.O. staff subsequent to receipt of the letter.)
- (3) This information was published to the Staff of the P. & R.O. in order 35A, dated December 31st, 1916.

In view of the publicity given to the War Office letter, as far as the Staff of the P. & R.O. are concerned, it must be considered in the nature of a command that they avail themselves of the facilities afforded, unless unforeseen circumstances preclude such a course; and, unless satisfactory explanation of their failure to so procure their dental treatment can be afforded, their claims cannot be considered and the expense must be borne by them individually.

Those claims, however, which were incurred previous to the publication of your order 35A, that is, claims previous to Dec. 31st, 1916, or claims for treatment authorized and begun before that date, will be a charge on public funds in proportion as arranged by you; but all subsequent claims, except in the circumstances laid down in the War Office letter, must be paid by the individuals concerned.

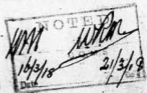
