



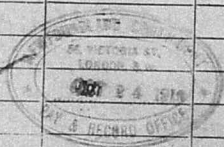

Dear Sir;

I received a communication from Mr. W. P. Potter, Barrister and Solicitor of Lunenburg, N. S., concerning Private Max W. Thornhill, ex-Royal Newfoundland Regiment (Deceased) # 1926, who was previously residing at Fortune, but was lost at Sea from the Schooner "Alpaca" about the 13th. of April this year. He left a Widow and two small children.

The Lawyer is of the opinion that the husband was badly wounded in France while serving with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment and that he was discharged from Army "C3", which should possibly have entitled this man to a Pension, but I understand he did not receive one.

Mr. Potter wishes to know the name of the Medical man who examined Thornhill just previous to his discharge from the Army. 
The above named Max W. Thornhill was lost at sea from the Schooner "Alpaca" about the 13th of April, 1928 and his widow, Lillias Ann Thornhill has consulted me with reference to some matters in connection with his estate.

In the course of the conversation the widow told me that her husband had been badly wounded while serving in France with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment and that he was discharged from the Army as C3 and since his discharge had been unable to obtain steady employment due to his wounds.

According to this man's discharge he enlisted at St. John's, Newfoundland on October 18th, 1915 and was discharged at St. John's, Newfoundland on July 5th, 1918. The discharge paper mentions the wound but does not give his category at the time.

His widow is left alone with two small children one Isabelle, aged nine years, and one Alice, aged seven years, and as I understand expects a still further addition to the family. She is in necessitous circumstances and as an Ex-Service man myself I should be very much obliged if you will be good enough to look up this man's medical history sheet and let me know if there is any possibility of a pension being awarded to his widow and children as well as payment of arrears of what appears to be justly due to her.
